Admitted Executioner 'Doc' Barker Bare Crime Secrets; Maddox Released

Betrayed in the Bremer kidnaping by Al Capone's followers, one of "Scarface Al's" executioners in the St. Valentine's Day massacre avenged himself and his comrades by laying the seven victims at Capone's door.

This was the explanation that came yesterday from police and government sources for the purported confession of Byron Bolton, naming Capone as instigator of the massacre, and himself, Fred Burke, Fred Goetz, Claude Maddox, Gus Winkler and Murray Humphreys as the slayers.

BOTH TALK FREELY.

At St. Paul, where they are under indictment with twenty others for the \$200,000 ransom abduction of Edward G. Bremer, banker, Bolton and his associate, Arthur ("Doc") Barker, both were reported to be adding freely to the government's stock of information on the massescre and other crimes.

This information has not been reayed to state officials. As a con sequence, Maddox, seized here Saturday after being named by Bolton, was released by Chicago police last night, since his part in the sixyear-old crime remains to be substantiated.

Bolton is understood to have rerealed that the gang led by Burke was organized at least two years prior to the massacre, and that by 1928 he was a full-fledged member, criving the getaway car for the gunmen in a number of "jobs."

OTHERS ACCUSED.

With Burke, Goetz, Winkler and himself in the gang were Joseph O'Riordan, once a member of the Detroit Purple gang, suspected in plot to kidnap Edsel Ford for \$1,-000,000 ransom in 1927, and Robert Conroy, brother-in-law of O'Riordan, a murderer, counterfeiter and the man whom Al Capone, at least, believed to be the Lindbergh kid-

Bolton's story is said to have rerealed that the massacre was only one episode in the operations of

the ruthless band.

He is reperted to have asserted that Burke was the slayer of George Ziertara, a policeman killed at Toledo in 1928 when the gang captured an American Express money wagon containing \$180,000 for the payroll of an auto plant.

POLICE TO RELEASE **ACCUSED GANGSTER**

Maddox, Reported Named in Massacre, Not Wanted on Any Charge.

By the Associated Press.

CHICAGO, January 28 .- No one, it seems, wants Claude Maddox, one-time gangster named in an alleged "con-lession" in connection with the St. Valentine's day massacre, so Chicago police have turned him over to the uburban Berwyn police who arrested They will likely release him.

Maddox was arrested Saturday after published reports said that Byron Bolton, held as a member of the Barker-Karpis gang responsible for the \$200,-000 Edward G. Bremer kidnaping, named Maddox along with Fred (killed) Burke, and others, as the men responsible for the slayings in which even George (Bugs) Moran gangsters were killed in 1929.

In the show up here Maddox was not dentified in any recent crimes. authorities said they were not able to connect him with the massacre because at the time of the killing he had an alibi that he was being arraigned in court on a disorderly conduct charge.

Existence of the "Bolton confession" repeatedly has been denied by Federal

authorities.

The Herald and Examiner, nevertheless, published a story yesterday again emphasizing that the "confession" was a fact, and added that the reason Bolton talked was because he learned that followers of Al Capone reputedly had given Government men information that led to unraveling of the

MADDOX HELD ON SUSPICION

Claude Maddox, ex-Capone gangster," whom Byron Bolton is said to have named last week as one of the six participants in the St. Valentine Day's massacre of 1929, was held at the detective bureau last night.

Two Berwyn policemen had arlested him as he entered his home it 2440 S. Oak Park av.

Turned over to Chicago police he was questioned by Detective Chief Sullivan. He scoffed at the massacre charge, but was held for buday's showup. The chief said he was "not wanted" here,

The alibi given by Claude Maddex when he was arrested after the 1929 St. Valentine's day massacre, that he was in court at the time the seven Moran gangsters were slain in the North Clark street garage, was apparently regarded by the police as a bar to prosecution in the case yesterday when Chief of Detectives, John L. Sulivan announced that Maddox would be held for the regular Sunday showup "like any other hoodinm," but that he is not wanted for any particular crime. Federal authorities told Chief Sullivan they were not interested in the prisoner.

Maddox was seized by two Berwyn policemen yesterday morning as he was entering his/home in that suburb, where he lived under the name of John Moore. He was turned over to the Chicago police.

Maddox had been named as one of the St. Valentine's day slayers in a purported confession by Byron Bolton, now being held in St. Paul in connection with the kidnaping of Edward G. Bremer. Besides Maddox and himself, Bolton was said to have declared that Fred Goetz. Murray Humphreys, Gus Winkler, and Fred [Killer] Burke were the execution squad. Goetz and Vinkler are dead. Burke is serving a life sentence for murder and Humphreys is in Leavenworth penitentisty for violation of the income tax law.

MADDOX IN CELL; NOBODY WANTS TO QUIZ HIM

Police and Federal Men Both Say They're 'Not Interested.'

ONCE AID OF CAPONE

Claude Maddox, alias Johnny Moore, found himself in a police call today because some one sald that he was one of the Capone m chine gunners who wiped out seven Moran gangsters in the St. Valentine day massacre five years ago.

Chief of Detectives John L. Sullivan didn't quite know what to do ebout Maddox.

"So far as I know," said Chief Sullivan, "Maddox has no connection with the massacre. We don't want him in Chicago for any crime.

"But on general principles we'll hold him for the showup tomorrow afternoon."

Sits in Cell and Broods.

Mr. Maddox sat in his cell and brooded over the evils that can befall a poor, hardworking tavernkeeper who gets his name in the

Since the government repealed the "Scarface Al" Capone gang and prohibition, Maddox has been operating a tavern at 2241 South Cicero avenue, Cicero (advt.), Maddox used to be a trusted member of the Capone gang, doing various odd jobs in the way of educating vivals to the wisdom of staying out of the syndicate's territory.

-Maddox in Court at Time. Earlier this week reports bublished that Byron Bolton, Barker-Karpis gangster, had "con-fessed," naming himself, Maddox and four others as the machine gunners in the massacre. The only discrepancies in the report were that government agents who had Bolton in custody branded it as so much hooey and that Maddox-who is not one of the Dionne quintuplets-was in court at the time of the massacre. A reporter for The Daily News went out to see Maddox the day the "confession" was published. Maddox was found hiding behind a straightup of beer. He pointed out that he was in court at the time the massacre was perpetrated, that he couldn't be in two places at once and so had nothing to fear.

The court statement was sup-ported by his attorney, Tyrell Richardson, and by officials.

Officials Seize Maddox. Two zealous Berwyn policemen

tais morning seized Maddox as he was entering his home at 2410 South Oak Park avenue. They found no weapons other than a nail file in his possession,

Berwyn authorities turned him him over to Chicago police. After the showup tomorrow Chief Sullivan said he would turn Maddox back to Berwyn. Daniel M. Ladd, agent in charge of the division of investigation here, said he didn't want Maddox.

Nobody wants Maddox, it seems. except his bartenders and waiters. And, so far as Chief Sullivan is co rned, they can have him and gold riddance.


Claude Maddox, recently named as one of the gunmen in the St. Valentine Day massacre, was locked up today at the detective bureau.

Maddox, who once led the notorious "Circus Gang," was involved in the slaughter by syron soliton whose confession of also taking part in the crime was printed exclusively by The Chicago American.

Maddox, a public enemy of long standing, was seized by two policemen as he drove up to his home at 2440 S. Oak Park av. in Berwyn early today.

The reported confession of Bolton, which was made to the government before he was sent to St. Paul for a kidnaping trial, has not been turned over to police and without this evidence Chief of Detectives Sullivan said that Maddox could not prosecuted. He will be held for the crime show-up tomorrow.

CAPTURED FOR MASSACRE

Gunman, Unarmed, Is Corralled at Home by Berwyn Officers,

Claude Maddox, gangs est unman and public enemy, was eized and jailed today for inrestigation of his alleged part in the St. Valentine's Day massacre.

Maddox was named by Byron Bolton as one of the machine gunners in an exclusive story printed by The Chicago American.

Maddox is the only one of the machine gunners named by Bolton who was alive or at large.

SEIZED AT DOOR OF HOME.

He was captured without sensation as he drove up in front of his home at 2440 S. Oak Park av., Berwyn, at 5:20 a. m. today by two policemen of the suburb.

Detective Charles Rudderman and Patrolman Frank Mitchell aw him drive past in an expensive realed him to the front door of this residence and as Maddox lett his car they placed him under arrest.

A search disclosed that he was unfarmed, nor was there a sen in the car.

He was bustled off to the Berwyn police station despite profane protests. The detective bureau in Chicago was notified.

Guarded by several officers, he was then sped to the Chicago police headquarters and taken to the bureau of identification.

DENIES HE IS MADDOX.

When first seized he tried to escape arrest by asserting that his name was John Moore, an old alias. The two suburban policemen knew him, however.

As soon as his fingerprints were taken at the Bureau of Identification he admitted his true identify. Surlily he refused to answer questions of Deputy Chief of Detectives Walter Storms, who at once notified Chief John L. Sullivan of the agreet.

VAS LONG SUSPECTED.

Maddox has been long suspected that never directly involved in the 1929 slaughter. Bolton, now in St. Paul and under indictment for taking part in the kidnaping of Edward G. Bremer, confessed to the government that he had taken a part in the massacre.

The same story, related to friends in Chicago and obtained by The Chicago American, named the killers beside Bolton and Maddox as Muuray Humphreys, now in prison for income tax fraud; Gus Winkle, slain; Fred ("Killer") Burke, sering a life term for murder, and Fred Goetz, slain.

BUTLER DEEMS BOLTON STORY TRUE PICTURE

That Byron Bolton's story of the St. Valentine Day massacre appears to be a true picture of what actually took place was the opinion expressed today by Walker Butler, who as assistant state's attorney was in charge of the massacre investigation in 1929.

The most significant phase of Bolton's story, he said, was the description of Burke, Goetz and Winkler. Butler expressed the opinion that the presence of Murray Humphreys "might be wrong," and that if he had named Tony Capezio in his place the confession would be perfect. He said.

"We raided Bolton's home downstate after we trailed a trunkshipped from Capone's flat in
Cicera. We missed Burke by just
a few minutes.

"However, we found numerous, pictures of Capone and others of his 'mob'. There was a picture of Burke in the Bolton home with two front teeth missing, and the witnesses to the slaying stressed the fact that one of the killers in police uniform had two front teeth missing."

Butler was associated in the investigation with Harry S. Ditchburne, also an assistant state's attorney, who also declared that Bolton's confession was supported by the facts gleaned at the time.

Sergt. Samuel Loftus, a veteran of the police force, was the first policeman to enter the garage after the slaying of the seven. Today he said of Bolton's story:

"Every detail that Rolton outlined is true to my personal mowledge. I lived that case and as a matter of fact I am still working on it."

CAPT. GILBERT AGREES.

And Capt. Daniel Gilbert, who was then in charge of the police district where the murders took place and now in charge of the state's attorney's police force, corroborated Sergt. Loftus. He said:

"Bolton entered into the picture then as a likely bird. The Maddok angle is not only possible but II believe that it is the answer to the puzzle of his alibi. We knew Maddox was there, but couldn't grove it."

GANG MASSACRE FINGER POINTS TOWARD CAPONE

Former Crime Overlord Is Thought Possible

CHICAGO, Jan. 25 .- (A) -- Seven dead men, victims of the St. Valentine's day massacre, cast a shadow today over the possible fate of Al Capone.

From graves where they have lain since 1929, the victims of Chicago's bloodiest crims were said in reports published here to be the most serious threat to the former gang lord's safety since his conviction on a federal income tax evasion charge.

. The Herald and Examiner stated that Byron Bolton, held in St. Paul charged with a part in the Bremer kidnaping, had confessed as "finger man" for the mass slaying and had named the actual slayers, listing five names familiar in underworld haunts.

Though U.S. government officials were quick to deny they had a confession, the newspaper said federal officers were hopeful of tracing those seven murders down to the original public enemy No. 1, Al Capone, now in Alcatraz prison.

The report quoted Bolton as attributing the messacre to henchmen hired by Capone to protect his interests in a Lyons, Ill., dog race track after the George (Bugs) Mo-ran gang and Frank Uals, New York and Chicago gangster, at-tempted to "muscle in" on the profits.

Those named as killers, who left Murder Charge Against Murray Humphreys, once No. 1 apone man, now in Leavenworth on an income tax evasion conviction; Fred (Killer) Burke, serving a term in a Michigan prison for slaying a St. Joseph policeman; Gus Winkler, North Side gambler killed a year ago; Claude Maddox, leader of the extinct Circus gang, the only one now at large, and Fred (The Brains) Goetz, University of Illinois graduate, who turned gangster. Goetz was slain last year

Reports said that Bolton, taken in a raid here Jan. 10, the night federal bullets slew Russell Gibson, Karpis-Barker gangster, confessed he was the man who rented a room opposite the Clark st. garage and gave the signal when the Moran mobsters arrived at their headquarters.

The Herald and Examiner pointed out that, should a case be developed against Capone, the federal gov-ernment might turn the former bootleg king over to the state for prosecution on a murder charge when his 10-year term for tax evasion and one year for contempt are completed. And others implicated might be brought from their prison cells to face prosecution for the gory murders that were credited with focusing attention of the federal government on the menace of Chicago's war lords.

Following the murders, police sought the slayers. Arrests were made, but alibis brought freedom though ballistics experts said evidence pointed to Bolton, a former navy machine-gunner. Burke and Maddox were also listed by police at the time as suspects.

The crime has been listed five years as an unsolved mystery.

Claude Maddox Sale to Have Been Named Here by Bolton.

Chicago, San. 26.—(P)—Claude Maddox, recently reported named in a confession by Byron Bolton as one of six men involved in the St. Valentine's day massacre of 1929, was seized early today by squads from the detective bureau at his home in suburban Berwyn.

He was taken to central police headquarters for questioning by John L. Sullivan, chief of detec-

tives.

Bolton, held in St. Paul on charges of complicity in the \$200,000 kidnaping of Edward G. Bremer, was reported earlier this week to have confessed that he acted as "finger man" in the massacre which wiped out seven members of the George (Bugs) Moran gang in a

George (Bugs) Moran gang in a north side garage.

Maddox was the only person named in the alleged confession who is not either dead or in prison. Others Bolton was reported to have named were Murray Humphreys, once No. 1 Capone henchman, now in Leavanworth saming man, now in Leavenworth serving a term for income tax evasion; Fred (Killer) Burke now in a Michigan prison for the slaying of a St. Joseph policeman; Fred (the brains) Goetz, university graduate who turned gangster and was slain a year ago; Gus Winkler, gambler killed last year, and Maddox.

Now 35 years old, Maddox was former owner of the Circus cafe where the gangsters were said to have consorted. He was seized when he arrived at his home early this

morning.

The massacre was said to have been attributed by Bolton to war-fare between the Capone and Moran mobs over the profits of a dog race track at Lyons, Ill. Federal officials promptly denied that Bolton had confessed or that he had been

questioned concerning the massacre.
Sullivan asserted, however, Maddox was not wanted by the Chicago police. He indicated Maddox would be held for the regular Sunday showup of crime suspects.

Madinx rose to prominence as a protege of Al Capone. After the massacre he was arrested and quizzed, but released for lack of evidence. Later he was indicted for assault to kill but was not brought to trial. He still is listed as a public enemy by the Chicago Crime commission.

Harry Ditchburne, former assistant state's attorney who conducted the investigation into the massacre, disclosed today that when investi-gators from the homicides quad rushed from headquarters in the central police station to answer the massacre call they rode down the same elevator with Maddox, who had appeared in court on a disorderly conduct charge, and his attorney

CONFESSION' IN MASSACRE STIRS U. S. OFFICIALS

Bolton Story Receiving Serious Consideration by Department.

Special Dispatch from a Staff Correspondent.
Washington, D. C., Jan. 24.—Publication of "confessions," attributed to department of justice sources, was receiving the attention of high officials of the department here to-

Officials of the department, whose agents are noted for their refusal to talk for publication, were irritated at reports published in Chicago that Byron Bolton, Barker-Karpis gangsters indicted in the Bremer kidnaping at St. Paul today, had "confessed" the St. Valentine day massacre, naming five other hoodlums as his aids in the mass murder of seven Moran gangsters.

Bolton's confession to agents on file in the department of justice quarters in Washington does not mention the St. Valenting day reassacre, officials said flatly today.

Trace Origin of Story.

In view of the fact that the department, according to officials, obtained no statement, oral or written, from Bolton in which the St. Valentine day massacre was so much as mentioned, the officials were seeking to trace the origin of the story.

From time to time there have been slight "leaks" in the department of justice offices at Chicago. and, while yesterday's report was simply an irritant, the other situation has aroused grave concern of the part of officials and a determined effort to halt such "leaks" is under way.

Department Made Vulnerable.

The secrecy with which the department conducts its work, while admirable in many respects, observers point out, together with their agents' policy of announcing "I have nothing to say," makes the department peculiarly vulnerable in the matter of denials when an unfounded article is published.

Attorney-General Homer S. Cumnings, in discussing Bolton's indistrient at St. Paul today, branded as "ompletely erroneous" the published report of his "massacre confession."

Gang Massacre Valentine Day Is Held Solved

Chicago Reports Suspect Confessed, Implicating 5 Others in Crime.

Copone May Be Tried For "Massacre" As Henchman Confesses

CHICAGO, Jan. 24.—Alphonse Capone, imprisoned gang overlord, may be brought from Alcatraz island penitentiary to answer for the ghastly St. Valentine's day massacre of seven Moran gangsters here in 1929.

This possibility loomed today following the disclosure by international news service that Byron Bolton, now a feleral prisoner, had made a detailed statement of the massacre to department of justice agents. Bolton and five others were named as the killers.

While police officials began to reshuffle their scanty evidence in the gruesome mass murder federal officials were said to be hopeful of linking Capone to the crime with the object of sending him to the electric chair, if possible.

Killers Were Capone Men.

Those named as the actual murderers who lined up seven of George (Bugs) Moran's gang against a N. Clark st. garage wall and mowed them down with machine gun fire were known to be affiliates of the Capone mob, then engaged in a war for supremacy against Moran's men.

They were Murray Humphreys, Gus Winkler, Fred (Killer) Burke, Claude Maddox and Fred Goetz. Humphreys, who succeeded Capone to the gangland throne, is now in prison at Leavenworth, Kan. Burke is serving a life term at the Marquette (Mich.) penitentiary. Winkler and Goetz were murdered and only Maddox, leader of the "circus" gang, Capone affiliate, is at large.

As police authorities dug back into their investigation new evidence was brought to light. Bolton's brother, John, had been sought as a participant in the massacre, police announced. So had John Conroy, found slain in New York in 1932.

Admits He Was Killer.

Bolton in his confession said he was one of the killers. Police had been trailing the former Egans' rats gangster as the man who conducted the death watch in a rented room across the street from the massacre garage. He was first connected with the crime when a letter addressed to him and postmarked from Thayer. Ill., was found in the abandoned room.

Conroy, it was disclosed by Detective Frank Morrell, was also known as Robert Newberry. When Burke was first linked to the St. Valentine day murders a search for Conroy, one of Burke's henchmen, was begun. The hunt ended when Conroy was found dead in a New York hat,

Morrell said.

POLICE TELL NEW SECRETS OF 1929 **GANG MASSACRE**

Pick Flaws in Reported Bolton Confession.

New evidence uncovered in the investigation of the St. Valentine's day massacre of seven north side gangsters came to light last night on the heels of published reports that Byron Bolton, now a federal prisoner, has made a full confession, naming hijnself as one of the killers.

Despite the fact of emphatic (enials from department of justice agents that Bolton made a confession, either written or oral, and despite the fact that the new evidence tended to disprove many details of the purported confession, the reports persisted that it had been made.

Reveal New Fugitives.

The new stories of the investigation of the massacre of the George [Bugs] Moran gangsters, brought to light the fact that Bolton's brother, John, also had been sought for participation in the crime, as had John Conroy, who was found dead in a New York flat two years ago.

Accordings to the reported Bolton confession, those named in addition to Bolton himself were Fred [Killer] Burke, Gus Winkler, Murray Humphreys, Claude Maddox and Fred

Of these, Burke is serving a life term in the Michigan state penitintilry; Humphreys is serving a tem for income tax violations, and Goltz and Winkler are dead. Only Maddox is now at large.

Hunted Since Massacre.

Since shortly after Feb. 11, 1029, Byron Bolton had been sought as one of two men who rented a room across the street from the garage headquarters of the Moran gang at 2122 North Clark street.

There he is supposed to have watched for an opportunity to catch Moran and his entire gang in the garage at one time, then call for the gangland executioners.

Bolton was linked with this rôle when a letter addressed to him and postmarked from Thayer, T??.. found in the room. At that time Policeman Frank Morrell, assigned to the investigation, made a trip to Thaver. He found Bolton's parents, ottained a picture, and discovered that Balton had been in the navy during

the war. Linked to "Death Watch."

The picture later was identified as that of the man who rented the room where the death watch was kept.

Bolton's trail led next to St. Louis, the town where both he and Burke got their starts with the Egan's Rats gang. It was in St. Louis, apparently that Bolton became associated with the Arthur Barker-Alvin Karpis gang, new blamed for the \$200,000 kidnapirg

of Edward G. Bremer. Bolton was finally captured in a apartment at 3820 Pine Grove avenu where a companion, Russell Gibson, wanted in the Bremer kidnaping, was killed attempting to shoot his way out of the government trap.

According to the purported confession, Bolton admitted renting the "death watch" room and occupying it as police had suspected, but he did

not mention his brother. In addition, the report had it, Bolton joined the actual slayers when they entered the garage, and fired one of the machine

Burke and Goetz the "Police."

Burke and Goetz, according to the reputed confession, were the two men dressed as policemen. They were chosen, Bolton is reported to have said, because they were not known to the Moran gang. The motive for the slaying, as Bolton is reported to have told it, involved the hiring of Frankie Uale, New York gang leader, by the north siders to aid in the war against Al Capone over operations of a dog track

in Lyons, Ill.

Point Flaw in Story.

There police found the first main law in the reputed Bolton confession t was pointed out that Uale was dain in New York on July 1, 1928 nearly eight months before the massacre took place.

In addition, Policeman Morrell, who spent many months in his investigation, declared that he never had heard the names of Humphreys or Maddox connected with the actual massacre.

Burke, Goetz and Winkler had been regarded as likely suspects, he said, and, in addition, two other men were mentioned. They are John, the brother of Byron Bolton, and Robert Conroy, who was found dead in a New York flat in 1932.

Question Omission of Conroy.

Conroy, whose real name was Rol ert Newberry, was sought in 1929 at a member of Burke's gang, and one of the participants in the massacre itself. Policeman Morrell pointed out that if Byron Bolton made a confession, it was extremely likely that Conroy's name would have been mentioned.

KILLER SAVED FROM GUNS OF FOFS

Lieut. Otto Erlanson, veteran head of the police homicide squad, declared today he believes Byron Bolton's sensational story of the 1929 St. Valentine's Day septuple gang massacre "is true in every line" as printed exclusively in The Chicago American.

Lieut. Erlanson went to work on the amazing case within a matter of minutes after the seven adherents of George ("Bugs") Moran were found slaughtered by machine gun fire in the gang garage headquarters at 2122 N. Clark st.

CONSTANTLY MENTIONED."

Today he had finished examining huge box of massacre records and declared:

"I believe The Chicago American's story is correct in every line from my investigation, which started right after the murders.

"When Bolton was arrested January 8 in the raid when Russell Gibson was killed by federal men, I recalled at once that he was constantly mentioned in our investigation."

It was while in federal custody after the January 8 raid on an apartment hide-out at 3920 Pine Grove av., that Bolton told to government agents the full story of the massacre, admitting that he was one of the four machine gun killers.

U. S. GUARDS STATEMENT.

The government is carefully guarding Bolton's formal statement, but friends of the gangster, to whom he previously had told the story, revealed it exclusively to The Chicago American.

ain that story, Bolton described the four machine gunners as having been himself, Claude Maddox, Glis Winkler and Murray Humphrays. Fred ("Killer") Burke and Fred Goetz, he added, posed as policemen in full uniform to set the stage for the carnage.

"PLAUSIBLE:" SULLIVAN.

Chief of Detectives Sullivan displayed intense interest in Bolton's story and said:

"It sounds plausible and has all the earmarks of being true."

He planned to confer today with Commissioner of Police Aliman to make plans for bringing Bolton back to Chicago should he escape conviction in the \$200,000 Edward G. Bremer kidnaping in St. Paul, for which he faces almost certain indictment.

Chief Sullivan said the government refused police permission to take Bolton to the detective bureau for questioning before he was taken to St. Paul, although an offer was made for police to quiz him in the Bankers' Building offices of the division of investigation, Department of Justice.

REGALLS RENTED ROOM.

Lieut. Erlanson recalled that a woman living across the street from the Moran garage rented to a mysterious stranger a room fronting on Clark st., with an unobstructed view of the garage front.

That room, it was established soon after the massacre, was used as a watching post.

Bolton, in his story, described himself as its tenant.

Lieut. Erlanson declared today the landlady at the time described her roomer in a manner which tallied with Bolton's description. Also, a letter addressed to Bolton from his old home town of Thayer, Ill., was found in the room, definitely linking him with the case.

FIND WRECKED AUTO.

Bolton's explanation of the "policemen" roles played by Burke and doctz, who were unknown to the lioran gang, to gain entry without suspicion to the garage also his beene out by his information, the police officer said. Lieut. Erlanson recalled that the night star the massacreme large Cadillac touring car, identical with those used by detective bureau squads at that time, was found practically destroyed in a Cicero prairie.

The automobile had been drenched with gasoline, set after and bombed. Only the chassis ramained. Serial numbers had been filed away, Lieut. Erlanson said, but science managed to reproduce them so that the car was traced through the hands of several dealers and owners—including Maddox, who then headed the murderous "Circus Gang" of the Northwest Side.

Lieut. Erlanson said Maddox was questioned, having at once fallen under suspicion, but glibly explained away the automobile angle.

Burke has always intrigued his interest, the officer said, but he has never been able definitely to hook the notorious killer to the crime. He declared today:

"If Burke would talk the whole case would be cleared up."

Burke is serving a life sentence at hard labor in the Michigai paison at Marquette for murdering a St. Joseph Mich., policeman, When arrested at St. Joseph, Mo.,

When arrested at St. Joseph, Mo., for the policeman's murder, some months later, Burke's young wife, the innocent daughter of a small farmer, declared Burke and Bolton were close friends and frequently took trips together to Great Falls, Minn., and elsewhere.

SOUGHT TO KILL BOLTON.

The Chicago American also learned that Bolton barely beat the guns of gangland when he revealed the details of Chicago's most spectacular crime.

To seal his lips Bolton's erstwhile

underworld confederates had been waiting with weapons primed and cocked until the time was ripe.

Bolton, they argued, was a sick man, always loquacious, and a man who has wanted to talk for some time.

Instead, they either dallied too long or were unable to locate their target and the record of that gory crime has been put down in black and white through the story spilled from Bolton's own lips.

STORY 'RINGS TRUE'.

Bolton's story, as published exclusively yesterday in The Chicago American, was told, his friends say, only because he had "gone soft."

But the members of the coroner's

jury who spent months in question-ing of witnesses covering more than 5,000 closely typed pages of testimony, declare that his story, rings true.

Burt A. Massee, prominent Chicagoan and foreman of the jury, said:

"He seems to have a pretty good knowledge of the whole af-fair doesn't he? I don't recall having run across the name of Bolton in the actual slaying but I do know that Burke was definitely connected as a suspect, We proved that with Col. Calvis, Goddard's ballistics test of the spent shells."

EXPOSE IS PRAISED.

Praise for the first real story of the slaying was offered to The Chicago American today by Walter W. L. Meyer, assistant to the Probate Judge of Cook County and a noted leacher of criminal law. He said:

"This is a wonderful expose after so many years, I'm inclined to believe that Burke was connected with the shooting and I think that Bolton might have had something to do with it. "There are some phases of the story that I don't think are quite accurate. We definitely established the fact that only two machine guns were used, although Bolton claims that four men carried them. However, it is possible that only two of the gun carriers were the actual murderers. We traced the shotgun shells to two guns and afterward located them n Burke's home."

BOLTON'S PART CERTAIN. Dr. John V. McCormick, member the jury and dean of the Loyda University law school, said:

"Bolton's hookup with Burke 🎋 fairly certain. I first heard Boiton's name mentioned in the slaying about three months after the inquest, but I can't remember in what connection. If Bolton didn't take part in the shooting, I don't see why he has confessed that he did."

Col. Albert A. Sprague blamed Bolton's conscience for his confession to the federal men. He said:

CHICAGO, Jan. 23.—(AP)— Reports were published today that the underworld's most gory crime—the 1929 St. Valentine's day mass massacre of seven gangsters had been solved by the statement of Byron Bolton, held as a member of the notorious Karpis-Barker mob.

The Chicago American in a copyrighted story that Bolton had named all participants in the crime and that his written statement was now in the hands of J. Edgar Hoover, head of the division of investigation of the Department of Justice at Wash-

The story brought immediate and conflicting statements. Said Hoover, "there's not a word of truth in it." Said Police Capt. John Stege, underworld authority of the Chicago force, "It sounds probable." Said D. M. Ladd, agent in charge at the Chicago division of investiga-tion, "Federal agents have not questioned Bolton about the thessarre." thassacre,

In view of the conflicting statements it was recalled that for 10 days federal agents denied having in custody Mrs. Lester Gillis, "half pint" widow of the slain "Baby Face" Nelson and the refusal of local federal officers for days to admit they had custody of Arthur "Doc" Barker, apprehended the same night Bolton was taken after a raid in which Russell Gibson, another Karpis-Barker satellite was slain.

Named as trigger men and plotters in the fassacre by Bolton, the American said, were: Murray Humphreys, one time No. 1 man of the Capone mob. now serving a term in Leaven-worth for income tax evasion; Claude Maddox, hoodlum still at large; Fred "Killer" Burke, at large; Fred "Killer" Burke, serving time in Michigan for murder; Gus Winkler, slain un-derworld go-between; Fred "The Brains" Goetz, University man turned gangster, and Bolton. 

P<u>riso</u>ner Claims He Slew 7 in Valentine Massacre

By JAMES D. FOSTER
CHICAGO, Jan. 23 (U.S.)—Authorities investigating the story circulated here today that Byron Bolton had named himself and five others as the killers in the famous St. Valentine Day massacre in 1929, tonight expressed doubt it was true, almost at the same time that J. Edgar Hoover of the Department of Justice labeled the tale as "bunk."

Bert M. Massee, foreman of the

Bert M. Massee, foreman of the coroner's jury which remained intact two years investigating the crime which cost the lives of seven "Bugs" Moran gangsters, said:

"I do not recall the name of Bolton ever being mentioned, but other names attributed to Bolton have been published frequently in connection with the slaying."

Bolton, at St. Paul, where he is held as a money passer in comection with the kidnaping of Edward G. Bremer, was arrested

 here two weeks ago when Federal agents killed his partner, Russell Gibson, in a raid on their apartment.

Authorities pointed out that Bolton may be attempting to have himself returned to this State for trial in connection with the slayings, hoping in the meantime for some avenue of escape, in order to defeat the Federal kidnaping prosecution which is almost certain to send him to prison.

The Valentine Day massacre occurred to the send him to prison.

The Valentine Day massacre occurred before the moon hour. Two men disguised as policemen drove up to the North Clark Street garage and entered, holding the seven men in custody and making them line up, facing a wall. Four other men entered bearing machine guns and mowed them down. Only a pet dog survived. Bolton, in his tale, claimed he was one of the machine-gunners.



U. S. Officials Deny Contession of St. Valentine's Day Massacre.

CHICAGO, January 28.-D. M. Ladd, agent in charge of the Division of Investigation, Department of Justice, denied a published story today that

Byron Bolton, Karpis-Barker gangster, had made any statement admitting participation in the 1929 St. Velen-tine's day massacre, in which seven

were slain. Botton, in a story published here today, was said to have admitted that he and five associates took part in the slaughter, naming as the others Fred "Killer" Burke, Claude Maddox, Gus Winkler, Fred Goetz and Murray Humphreys.

Ladd issued a formal statement in which he denied that Bolton had made any such admission, written or

oral. He said further that Federal agents had not questioned Bolton about the massacre because it was not in their jurisdiction, and that Chicago police authorities had not questioned Bolton

after his arrest.

He said that since Bolton was taken to St. Paul, he has remained in Federal custody, intimating that he could not have been questioned by local authorities there.
