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MMS To Hold Public Meetings/Hearings in Anchorage on Liberty Project DEIS

The Minerals Management Service will hold two public meetings/hearings on the draft Environmental Impact Statement for the Liberty Project on Thursday, February 15, 2001, from noon to 3 p.m. and 7-9 p.m. in the Wilda Marston Theater located at 3600 Denali Street.

The draft EIS evaluates the BP Exploration (Alaska) Development and Production Plan for the Liberty Project submitted to MMS in February 1998. BPXA proposes to develop Liberty from a gravel island on a Federal lease located about 6 miles from shore in Foggy Island Bay in the Beaufort Sea 20 miles east of Prudhoe Bay and about 8 miles east of its Endicott development. A sub-sea and onshore pipeline will connect Liberty Island to the Badami Oil Pipeline. The draft EIS analyzes BP's proposed development and production plan, the oil spill contingency plan, and a variety of alternatives, such as pipeline and island design and location, pipeline routing, and potential gravel sources.

BPXA estimates that there are 120 million barrels of recoverable oil in the Liberty Prospect. If approved, proposed construction would occur during two winter construction seasons beginning with the island in 2003 and the pipeline in 2004. First production would occur in late 2004. The State of Alaska will receive 27 percent of the rental fees and any Federal royalties.
