Communist propaganda appears in many guises. R is transmitted throughout the world in many ways. Perhaps the most insidious method used for its transmittal involves the use of dupes.

A Visit to a "Holy City" in the Soviet Union

Eleanor Roosevelt, in her syndicated newspaper column which is read by millions, has been telling her readers of her travels in the Soviet Union. On September 13, 1957, she related the details of her visit to the city of Zagorsk. She described this "holy city," as she called it, and mentioned the "shrine," the "monastery," and the "two churches" there. She told of the "continuous" religious service carried on there and made reference to the "unbelievably beautiful voices" of the "older women" chanting the service.

The widow of the late President Roosevelt went on to tell of the great amount of food available and the "hospitality and kindliness" she - found in that "holy city." (The Washington Daily News, 9/13/57)

Mrs. Roosevelt apparently would have her readers believe that communist leaders have changed their views on religion. What are those 62-62735-72 views? The record speaks for itself.

Memorandum to L. V. Luardman Re: Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt Information Concerning

In 1927, Joseph Stalin declared: "... The Party cannot be neutral... towards the reactionary clergy who poison the minds of the toiling masses. Mave we suppressed the reactionary clergy? Yes, we have. The unfortunate thing is that it has not been completely liquidated..."

In 1955, Nikita S. Khrushchev stated: "We remain atheists. We will do all we can to liberate a certain portion of the people from the charm of the religious opium that still exists...."(4)

The Present Viewpoint in Religion

Many will probably defend Mrs. Roosevelt's picture of a "holy city" in the Soviet Union by explaining that things have changed since Stalin's death. If so, they have only to read the latest Soviet publications which, recently, have been focusing attention on religious influences in that country. Typical of the comments found on this subject in various articles and editorials in the Soviet press are the following:

"...it is necessary for antireligious propaganda to stress the fact that all religion is unscientific...."

"In the strui,gle against religious survivals in the consciousness of a certain segment of the Soviet people it is necessary to make use not only of lectures but of all forms of political influence of the masses..."

"The victory of socialism decisively undermined the social roots of religion in our country...." (The Current Digest of the Soviet Press, 9/4/57, pp.12-15)

An American's Responsibility

Mrs. Roosevelt's visit to and her description in glowing terms of the "hol;" city" in the Soviet Union illustrates two important points: (1) Foreign "dignitaries" ar still being given "guided" tours in the Soviet Union designed to hoodwink them into praising the Soviet system; (2) Prominent Americans whose views are highly respected have a responsibility to the American public to present both sides of the picture in any discussion of the so-called developments in communist states. Otherwise, they become nothing more than dupes for communist propaganda.

Pages A3879-A3880, Congressman Forrester, (D) Georgia, excended his remarks to include an article written by Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt entitled 'Representative Walter Is Prejudiced' which appeared in the Washington Daily News of April 16, 1953. Mr. Forrester stated "Mrs. Roosevelt" says that Congressman Francis E. Walter is narrow and prejudiced because he has dared to suggest that the Treasury Department revoke the tax exemption of the Fund for the Republic; also, Mrs. Roosevelt hopes that our Nation will be able to go on enjoying the benefits that come from educational foundations performing the kind of work that the Fund for the Republic has been doing. Mr. Speaker, sometimes it seems when a Congressman lifts his voice in defense of the taxpayers, or in defense of constitutional government, or speaks out against unrestricted immigration which has permitted hundreds of Communists to come into this country, not for the purpose of preserving our country but to destroy it, that Congressman is immediately condemned as being narrow and prejudiced." He went on to state "It is noted, Mr. Speaker, that nowhere does Mrs. Roosevelt attempt to answer charges made by Congressman Walter against the Fund for the Republic, but expresses her hope that we will be able to go on enjoying the benefits that come from educational foundations able to perform the kind of work that the Fund for the Republic has been doing. On March 30, 1958, Congressman Walter released a statement laying down a bill of particulars against the Fund for the Republic." Mr. Forrester included excerpts from this statement which contained the following: "The fund has also financed attacks, junsupported by competent evidence, upon the loyalty, integrity, intelligence, P and mental stability of all confidential informants of the Federal Bureau of Investigation who have testified in public trials or proceedings. "

Eleanor Roosevelt wrote a scries of five articles entitled "On My Own" which appeared in the weekly publication "Saturday Evening Post," These articles reflect Mrs. Hoosevelt' life in autobiography form subsequent to the death of the late President Roosevelt.

In the article appearing in the March 1, 1958 edition of the "Spiurday Evening Post", Mrs. Roosevelt made the following statement concerning the Russian periphery: "But 1 think I should die if I had to live in Soviet Russia where I almost never heard laughter. When I spent a month traveling about Russia in 1957, the grim era of the Stalinist dictatorship had been replaced by the less fearful — in thinking at least—dictatorship of Nikita S. Krushchev, but the people still existed under a system of compulsion, and the power over them was still a hand of steel."

I Am Appalled By Publication

BOSTON — A publication called the American Legion Firing Line, prepared and distributed by the Nanal Americanism Commist, was recently sent to Its subscription rate is a year, and it is copynghted, thereby prohibiting reproduction of it in whole or in part without authorization. Therefore, I cannot quote from it.

I am appalled that a publication of this kind, attacking reputable people, sometimes by innuendo, should actually be published by a patriotic organization like the American Legion.

Does the Legion really believe we are in danger of becoming communists in this country? If it does, it has far less faith in our people than many of the people and organizations whom it attacks. No one who has ever been in a country where freedom exists, and has known the feel of it, will ever be tempted to accept the material benefits offered by communism as a substitute for freedom.

There are areas of the world in which, because of certain economic conditions, it is essential to socialize certain parts of the economy, but this does not mean in any way that these nations, if they have known freedom, will necessarily give up political and social democracy.

Such ignorance of the meaning of certain regious organizations is shown in this Legion pamphlet that I am a stounded de dintelligent people would pay \$3 a year to be misled.

Mrs. Bleanor Roosevelt, the well known columnist, has challenged the usefulness of an official American Legion publication "The Firing Lime" in her syndicated column "My Day."

She additionally attacks The American Legion for its fight against the international conspiracy of communism.

The American Legion has no quarrel with Mrs. Roosevelt. It has the deepest respect for what her family's name has signified on the American scene.

The Legion has, however, often disagreed with Mrs. Roosevelt's obvious willingness to defend the Soviet Union.

Many thousands of our country's veterans, in respecting her right to express personal opinions regarding communism, feel that she should speak from a factual basis rather than voice opinions based upon social pleasure junkets to Russia. There is no doubt as to Mrs. Roosevelt's ability as a journalist and her broad experience as a traveler. There is considerable doubt that she has seen or heard anything in Russia other than what the Kremlin has allowed her to see and hear. There is ample room for believing that Mrs. Roosevelt's utterings has contributed to complacency and lethargy insofar as the alarming sprea ed communism is concerned. Mrs. Reosevelt's allegations against The American Legion seems to be two-feld:

- (1) That our constant battle to expose the avowed enemies of the free world is needless and sometimes based upon innuendos;
- (2) That the Legion, in its December, 1958 edition of "The Firing Line" in exposing certain activities within the field of religion was, in effect, attacking the Methodist church.

The country's largest veterans organization has no apologies to make to anyone for its vigilance and alertness in assisting the Congress, the FBI and all true patriots in protecting the security of this country. This is no time to be lulled into a false sense of security. There is no innuendo or distortion in exposures made by the Legion in its publications.

Bach issue of "The Firing Line" is fully documented and checked carefully by a capable staff of legal experts, prior to publication. Mrs. Roosevelt may desire to check the record ms to ascertain how many law suits have been filed as a result of Legion exposure.

Although the healthy glare of the well focused spotlight often sends the guilty to cover, there is no real basis for martyrdom if sound facts have been used. The Legion has never attacked religion as such, and never could. Its "Back to God" movement is in strong support of all religions and its programs encourage religion in every aspect. Its ranks are made up of men of all faiths and creeds who have faced the tragedy of the battle field with God and prayer as the principal salvation.

As has often been stated: "There are no atheists in fox holes."

I have long been a member of the Methodist church and have proudly but humbly firmly believed in, and practiced my religion from the age of a small boy. Meither I, nor any mational commander, would allow an attack upon any church, faith or religion. The American Legion, however, refuses to believe that communism or subversive activities in any form can be classed as a religion. Attempts, therefore, to utilize religion as a "front" for such activities will be constantly exposed on a factual and documented basis whenever the opportunity presents itself. Mrs. Roosevelt may desire to join us in this worthy endeaver.


I was taught in senior social studies this year that she, in patronizing it, was unaware that it was a communist front.




In our anxiety to find Communists we are forgetting some of our basic principles. We regard people as innocent unless they are proved guilty. And we consider it important that people should be treated with humanity, not as though they were Russian subjects or pegs the state can more about as it chooses.

I dislike seeing us falling into the condition of using Soviet methods, which we are constantly saying we disapprove of. Yet these are the methods used by the subcommittee on Un-American Activities. I feel very strongly that our need today is for good teachers, and they must be loyal Americans. But they should not be fired or be held under suspicion because at some time in the past they held certain political beliefs or engaged in certain political activities.

In percetime we do not need to police our people in the way that seems to be considered necessary by the Un-American Activities Committee. On the whole, our teachers can be trusted. They believe in dur government and in our way of life. They may discuss what they think of our shortcomings but that is our right as free American citizens.

I think we would be better off if we suspected ess and left the job of proving wrongdoing to be proper authorities, such as the FBI and secret Service.





You will recall that by letter dated 6-15-61, Congressman Doyle made reference to an alleged statement by Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt that "We are almost finished with the McCarthy era, but I think that fear of possible infiltration by communism is prevalent. Bureau files reflect that we have 'and limited but cordial relations with Congressman Doyle. On a Baumgardner to Sullivan memorandum dated 6-20-61 (attached), it was recommended and approved that Congressman Doyle be contacted by a representative of my office, the letter be orally acknowledged and the Director's views on the menace of communism and communist infiltration be explained to him and that he be furnished pertinent current reprints concerning communism.

On the morning of 6-23-61, SA Hanning contacted Congressman Doyle. The Congressman was very cordial and stated that he is a great admirer of the Director and the Bureau. He stated he is particularly interested in communism masmuch as he is a member of the House Committee on Un-American Activities. He said that while he is a great admirer of Mrs. Roosevelt, he did not agree with the above statement. Hanning briefed the Congressman along the lines mentioned in the attached memorandum and the Congressman was most appreciative. He said he has already read the Director's book, "Matters of Deceit," but intends to study it further.

Personally, I've never had such a fear." The Congressman inquired "What about it? Inform me fully, please."

Bufiles rescal that we have had limited but cordial relations with Congressmen Doyle.

From the Congressman's letter it cannot be determined if he agrees or disagrees with the statements of Mrs. Roosevelt. The Director's book, "Proters of a ceit," and his numerous statements concerning the dangers of communist infiltration are well known to the general public and should be known to the Congress-It is felt that this matter can be best handled through a personal contact at which time the Congressman may be referred to Part 5 of "Hasters of Deceit" entitled "The Communist Trojan Horse in Action" which in detail describes the menace of communism and the efforts of the Party to infiltrate legitimate organizations in this country. The Congressman should also be furnished several items of literature containing the Director's views which are pertinent to his inquiry.

It is suggested the Congressman be furnished the reprint of the Director's articles which appeared in "Christianity Today" in the Fall of 1960; "Ave Haria" in April, 1960; "Communist Illusion and Democratic Reality"; "Expose of Soviet Espionage"; and the Director's statements on internal security dated, 4-17-61.

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NOTE ON ABTUM:

Bufiles contain so identifiable data concerning the correspondent. No identifiable information can be located concerning Youth Forum or Freedom Fightes in correspondent's area.

There is a Youth Forum in Dayton, Chio, which is a small group of eight high school students sponsored by a local newspaper. We have had cordial relations with the group in connection with Bureau tours. It is not known if this is the organization referred to by the correspondent. (94-50340)

We have a main file on Freedom Fightwa; however, this is an organization in Jacksonville, Florida, created to stop racial integration in the South. It is the subject of a pending racial matters investigation. It is not known if this is the organization referred to by correspondent and we have no record of such an organization in her area. (157-337)

There have been several "Freedom Forums" held in various cities of this country, one of which is the Dallas Freedom Forum. It assists in bringing the menace of communism to the attention of schools in the Dallas public school system. We have furnished Bureau speakers and a number of copies of the Director's speeches and articles for distribution at the Dallas Freedom Forum.

Since the specific organizations referred to by correspondent are unknown it is believed advisable to be rather directed in our reply. We normally advise correspondents that we have not investigated Mrs. Roosevelt; however, to do this in this instance might (reate the impression that we have investigated the organizations correspondent mentioned. Under the circumstances it is believed the above reply will best serve the Bureau's interests.



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

BACKGROUND:

James West and 6 others were convicted in U. S. District Court, Cleveland, Ohio, 1/29/58 of conspiring to defraud the U. S. Government by obtaining services of National Labor Relations Fourd through the use of false noncommunist affidavits and were sentenced to 18 months and fined \$2,500 each. On 2/20/61 the Supreme Court denied a petition for writ of certiorari and on 4/3/61 denied a petition for rehearing. West appeared at U. S. Marshal's Office, Cleveland, on 5/22/61 to begin his sentence and is incarcerated in Federal Prison, Terre Haute, Indiana.

Cleveland Office: "Rodman Douglas, Administrative Assistant to Congressman Charles Vanik, called at Cleveland Office today seeking general information concerning subject. Douglas stated that thru Welter Reuther the Congressman's office was informed of efforts to interest Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt in aiding the subject in his present difficulty. Stated he had reviewed the court record in the West case for information of interest and was now seeking any other general information such as a criminal record which could be utilized by Mrs. Roosevelt in making her decision in the matter. 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

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

PICKETING OF MRS. ELEANOR PROSEVELT AT UNITED NATIONS DAY PROGRAM IN MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA AUDITORIUM, 10/26/61

The following information was received on October 24, 1961, from a source who has furnished reliable information in the past.

On October 23, 1961, the Florida States Rights Party held a meeting at the address of the President of the group, Maria Marini, 5318 Northwest Marini, Florida.

Discussed at this meeting was a United Nations
Day program which was to be held at the Miami Beach,
Florida Auditorium on October 26, 1961. At this program
Mrs. ELEANOR ROOSEVELT was a scheduled speaker, and a
plan was formulated to picket Mrs. ROOSEVELT on the outside
of the Miami Beach Auditorium. Placards were to be carried
by the individuals who were picketing Mrs. ROOSEVELT,
and the writing which appeared on them was as follows:

"Comrades, Mrs. ROOSEVELT, Russia, Red China"



PICKETING OF MRS. ELEANOR ROOSEVELT

Source further advised that the Florida States Rights Party, the John Birch Society and Americans for Action Party would participate in the picket, and that it was expected that 25 to 50 persons from each group would participate in the picket. The arrangements made by the Florida States Rights Party were that they would meet at the home of their President, KEITHLEY, at 6:30 P.M. on October 26, 1961, and then proceed to the Miami Beach, Florida Auditorium and begin their picketing at 7:00 P.M. Source noted that the 2 had been no discussion or designation as to which persons would carry placards.



Source stated that at the picket the pamphlet entitled "ELEANOR's Red Record" would be distributed.

PICKETING OF MRS. ELEANOR ROOSEVELT

On October 27, 1961, source advised that the above program was picketed on the night of October 26, 1961, Approximately 50 to 60 individuals participated in the picket, and distribution of literature. Participating in the demonstration were the Florida States Rights Party, Americans for Action Group and members of the John Birch Society. One individual on the picket carried the Confederate flag. Polish was proceed during the demonstration, no violence course, and except for an exchange of insults the demonstration are orderly.

The "Miami Harrid", a Minm', Florida daily newspaper, on October 1961, contained the following article captioned "Give Atom Bombs to UN -- Nrs. FDR".

"Ile world's stomic energy-including the super hydrogen bombs-should be turned over to the United Nations to be used toward universal peace, his. ELEANOR ROOSEVELT declared in Miami Thursday.

"'If that (atomic energy) stays in the hands of individual nations,' she warned, 'we will never be secure.'

"'It must be ruled out as a means of total destruction' she told the crowd of 9,000 at Mismi Beach Auditorium.

"Mrs. ROOSEVELT described the United States and Russia as being deadlocked in 'the most dangerous game of poker that could be played.'

"But she added hopefully: 'In the United Nations, what the Soviets are slowly doing is turning the whole would against them.'

"The wife of the late President said Soviet Premier NIKITA KHRUSHCE! I expected to frighten the nations of the world with fear of his power and with threats of a 50-megaton hydrogen bomb.

"But he has been greeted 'not with fear but resentment,' the said. 'More and more they dislike what they see.'

"In her wide ranging speech celebrating the 16th anniversary of the United Nations, Mrs. ROOSEVELT also declared:

The U.N. will emerge stronger and better prepared for the future as a result of the current crises.

"DAG HAMMARSKJOLD in the role of Secretary General turned the U.N. from a debating group into active organization.

"The United States is in a very strong position to negotiate on the Eerlin question.

"The United States must paint a picture of democracy for the rest of the world.

"The former first lady arrived in Miami at 1:25 p.m. at International Airport where she was welcomed by Mayor ROBERT KING HIGH, Commissioner HENRY RALABAN and Mr. and Mrs. FRANK DUNBAUGH.

"DUNBAUGH is chairman of the Greater Miami Chapter of the American Association for the United Nations and he introduced her at Thursday night's speech.

"Mrs. ROOSEVELT's otherwise cordial welcome was marred by picketing both at the airport and at the auditorium later.

"DOUGLAS VORILES, a Miami Shores real estate man, was identified as the person who contracted for a tow plane to fly over the airport with a banner reading 'Go Home ELEANOR.'

Mrs. ROOSEVELT did not get the message, however, arriving after it departed the skies.

"Pickets later marched around Miami Beach Auditorium brandi hing placards derogatory to Mrs. ROOSEVELT. Among other things they labeled her a member of the 'U.S. Troika,' along with NELSON ROCKEFELLER and WALTER REUTHER."

Could you possibly supply me with some proof of this, such as a list of these ortanizations? If you can not help me in this way, could you tell me how I might get such a list that would be acceptable as proof? What is your candid opinion of Mrs Roosevelt?

I was very much impressed with your speech of December 7 when you accepted the Mutual of Omaha Criss award. If there are any copies of your speech available, I would very much like to have one.



Mr. Kemper advised that should Mr. JaVie call back we will indicate that the Director is still cut and will not return in time for the 3:05PM broadcast.


