Programs/Initiatives

> S.H.I.E.L.D. 2002⁶

The Erie County Sheriff's Office S.H.I.E.L.D. 2002 highlights programs, policies, and initiatives that will be implemented by the agency. Components include:

- Stamping Out Drug And Alcohol Abuse: the Sheriff's Office will implement drug-related educational and enforcement initiatives.
- Highway Safety: the Sheriff's Office will focus emphasis on drugged, drunken and reckless drivers as well as other highway safety prevention issues.
- Integrated Community Policing: the Sheriff's Office will hold community forums to provide citizens with the opportunity to communicate with law enforcement.
- Eliminating Family Violence: the role of patrol officers will include working with social service and support groups to counsel families on prevention and assist victims of crime.
- Law and Order: Fighting Violent and Juvenile Crime: the Sheriff's Office will work to address adult and juvenile violent crime issues in the area.
- Department Reform: the Sheriff's Office will evaluate its current structure and procedures to determine the most effective method of operation.

➤ During 2002, there were 44 murders known to police in Buffalo. ¹⁴ There were 59 murders reported to police in Buffalo during 2003. ¹⁵

Drugs

- > Crack availability is increasing in Buffalo. 18
- ➤ Club drug use is spreading from New York City to Buffalo. 19
- ➤ Methamphetamine is hardly ever abused in Buffalo.²⁰

Enforcement

As of October 31, 2001, there were 1,143 full-time law enforcement employees working in Buffalo (933 officers and 210 civilians).²¹

Trafficking and Seizures

- ➤ Seizures of wholesale amounts of cocaine in Buffalo are frequently made at the airport and train station and weigh from 1/2 to 4 kilograms each.²²
- ➤ Buffalo acts as a port of entry for Southeast Asian heroin from Toronto en route to New York City and Detroit.²³

➤ Overland drug smuggling between the U.S. and Canada typically occurs along the Washington State-British Columbia border in the West, at the Detroit-Windsor and Buffalo POEs in the Great Lakes area, and along the Quebec and Ontario borders with New York, Vermont and Maine in the East.²⁴

Courts

- ➤ Drug Courts²⁵
 As of May 2004, there were 3 drug courts in Buffalo that had been operating for more than 2 years and 1 drug court that was being planned.
- ➤ There were 360 drug-related felony indictments in Erie County during 2002. ²⁶

➤ In 2002, there were 789 felony drug arrests prosecuted in lower courts (town, village, or city courts) in Erie County. There were 553 felony arrests prosecuted in upper courts (county or superior courts) in Erie County during 2002.²⁷

Corrections

- ➤ As of August 2, 2004, there were 1,560 inmates remanded to the Erie Sheriff's Department custody. The inmate count reflects the total of three facilities: Erie County Holding Center, Erie County Correctional Facility, and the Holding Center Annex.²⁸
- ➤ Of those convicted of felony drug offenses in Erie County lower courts in 2002 (465 convicted), 117 received a jail sentence.²⁹

Consequences of Use

➤ During 2002, there were 3,844 drug-related emergency department (ED) episodes reported in Buffalo. Cocaine was mentioned 1,441 times in the ED episodes.³¹

Treatment

- ➤ Individuals seeking methadone treatment at clinics in Buffalo during 2002 were much younger than abusers who sought treatment during the previous year. ³³
- ➤ Buffalo Substance Abuse Services: ³⁴
 - operates 5 treatment facilities and one substance abuse prevention program;
 - provides clinically established outpatient, ambulatory and accepted drug-free counseling and advocacy services to substance abusing individuals and their families:
 - provides complete medical exams to all clients screened deemed appropriate for services;
 - provides vocational/educational services for clientele and residents of Municipal Housing; and
 - provides residents, especially youths residing in Municipal Housing, with meaningful cultural, educational and recreational activities.
