Programs/Initiatives

Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.)⁶

D.A.R.E. is taught by uniformed police officers in a classroom setting to the 6th and 7th grade students of Jefferson City. Topics covered in the program include consequences, resisting peer pressure, building self esteem, managing stress, solving disagreements without violence and decision making skills. During the 2001-2002 school year, over 10,000 students had participated in the program.

Federal Funding

- Drug-Free Communities Support Program⁷
- Since FY 1998, funding for the Drug-Free Communities Support Program in Jefferson City was only received during FY 2001. In FY 2001, \$100,000 was awarded to ACT Missouri (MO Association of Community Task Force).
- Executive Office for Weed and Seed⁸ Jefferson City has never received Federal funding or been officially recognized as a Weed and Seed site.

- Jefferson City did not receive any funds for the FY 2001 Housing and Urban Development Drug Elimination Grant.¹¹
- Jefferson City did not receive any methamphetamine funding in 2002 from the Department of Justice's Office of Community Oriented Policing Services.¹²

Crime and Drug-Related Crime

During 1999, the crime index total for Jefferson City was 1,612.¹⁴ This number increased to 1,666 during 2000.¹⁵ During 2001, the crime index total for Jefferson City was 1,658.¹⁶

As of October 2001, there were 102 law enforcement employees in Jefferson City (74 officers and 28 civilians).¹⁹

As of September 2003, there were 2 drug courts operating for over two years and one drug court being planned in Jefferson City.

Corrections

In Callaway County during 2002, there were 36 prison admissions related to drugs and 62 probation admissions related to drugs. During 2002, there were 81 prison admissions and 125 probation admissions related to drugs in Cole County.²¹

Consequences of Use

- From 1990 to 2001, there were 76 deaths attributed to alcohol/substance abuse in Cole County.²² During this same time period, 45 deaths in Callaway County were attributed to alcohol/substance abuse.²³
- During 2001, there were 4 drug-related deaths in Callaway County and 7 in Cole County.²⁴

Substance Abuse Related Deaths, Callaway and Cole County, 1999-2001

Drug related emergency room visits increased from 122 during 1999 to 155 during 2001 in Callaway County. Drug related emergency room visits for Cole County also increased from 1999 (198 visits) to 2001 (281 visits).²⁵

Treatment

During 2002, there were 324 substance dependency/abuse treatment admissions in Callaway County. There were 554 substance dependency/abuse treatment admissions in Cole County during 2002.²⁶
