Shortly thereafter, Miss Clayton returned to the office and advised that the above mentioned card came through the mail with other letters and telegrams on the morning of October 29, 1937, and that the same had been handled by numerous people around the office.

Miss Clayton was advised that there was no Federal violation over which the Bureau had jurisdiction. She advised that they were to have numerous police guards around the banquet hall that night and that they did not feel anything would develop as a result of this card.

Miss Clayton advised that the home address of Joseph Cantor is 5532 Sunset Boulevard, Hollywood, California, and that his Secretary is Ben Holzman, telephone Woodbury 01007.

The writer, upon being advised of the above facts by Agent [redacted] telephonically communicated with Miss Ruth Clayton who was again advised that there was no violation over which the Bureau had jurisdiction, but that if they wanted the matter referred to the local police, the same could be done.

Miss Clayton stated she had discussed the matter with Mr. Cantor and that inasmuch as there would be police guards around the banquet hall, they did not deem it advisable to take the matter up with the local police. Miss Clayton was advised that the postal card would be forwarded to the Bureau for retention in its files.

The above mentioned card is being forwarded with copies of this letter to the Bureau, and inasmuch as there is no violation over which this Bureau has jurisdiction, no further investigation is being conducted.

Reference is made to your letter dated November 1, 1937, requesting advice as to the reason for not referring the threatening postcard received by Eddie Cantor at Los Angeles, California, on October 27, 1937, to the Postal Authorities for appropriate handling in view of the fact that there was no violation of the Federal Extortion Statute indicated therein.

In this respect your attention is invited to my letter dated October 29, 1937, confirming my telegram dated October 28, 1937, in which you were advised that this matter was originally referred to the Los Angeles Division by Postoffice Inspector C. D. Chance who at the time indicated that same did not constitute any Federal violation which would enable the Postoffice Department to take investigative jurisdiction. Although at the time it was realized that this matter would undoubtedly not be one which would indicate a violation of the Federal Extortion Statute within the investigative jurisdiction of this Bureau, it was believed advisable to obtain possession of the card in the event the writer should in the future direct any follow-up letters of extortion nature to the Victim in this case.

As you were advised in the above-mentioned letter, no further investigative action is being taken with regard thereto by this Division, and Miss Ruth Clayton, Secretary to Mr. Cantor with respect to the banquet which was given at the Ambassador Hotel, was advised as to the Bureau's lack of jurisdiction in this matter.

Dear Sir:

In confirmation of the telephonic information furnished by Special Agent [redacted] of this Division to [redacted] of the Bureau, there are being set forth hereinafter the results of discreet inquiries made by this Division with respect to the Winchell broadcast on Sunday night, November 14, 1937, with regard to the alleged plot to bomb Hollywood, California.

At the Personnel Department of the Fox Studios, Los Angeles, where Mr. Walter Winchell is presently under contract, it was ascertained that Mr. Winchell was at the present time back in New York City where he could be contacted through the New York Daily Mirror at 233 East 40th Street, New York City.

In pursuance of an inquiry which was made in the Los Angeles Division, Special Agent [redacted] furnished a memorandum with respect to the substance of the broadcast made by Mr. Winchell over Radio Station KMGH at 6:30 P. M., November 14, 1937. This memorandum indicates that Mr. Winchell in his broadcast stated that the Anti-Defamation Society of Hollywood, California, had in its possession documents tending to show that a group of individuals, whose purposes were contrary to those of the Anti-Defamation Society, had engaged in a plot to bomb the homes of numerous Hollywood residents. It further informed that this Society was in possession of the names of the plotters and have a copy of the original instructions with regard to the proposed bombing. At the conclusion of the broadcast Mr. Winchell stated that this information was to be turned over to the Department of Justice.

As a result of appropriate [redacted] inquiries made at the Los Angeles Police Department and the [redacted] office, Special Agent [redacted] ascertained that the Anti-Defamation Society is a Jewish organization with its National headquarters at

Chicago, Illinois, and local headquarters on the sixth floor of the Roosevelt Building in Hollywood, California, and that the object of the organization is to strike at the activities of Anti-Jews and Pro-Nazis. It was further learned that Rabbi Magain, whose Synagogue is on Wilshire Boulevard in Los Angeles, is the head of the organization at Los Angeles and that a Mr. Leon Lewis is secretary and a Mr. Charles Katz is an officer thereof. It might be mentioned here that Agent [redacted] is acquainted with [redacted] personally and that he believes, if the Bureau desires such action be taken, he would be able to secure full information with regard to the alleged bombing plot through Rabbi Magain, it being noted that the Anti-Defamation Society is considered a high-class organization in this vicinity.

However, in view of the instructions received telephonically from [redacted] to the effect that Special Agent [redacted] is presently en route to Los Angeles with regard to Nazi matters, no further action will be taken in this regard unless the Bureau should specifically request that same be done.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TAMM.

With reference to the Nazi investigation the Director asks me about a statement which had been made by Walter Winchell on his Sunday night broadcast concerning the information which the Anti-Defamation League has in its possession.

The Anti-Defamation League in Hollywood, California possesses documents tending to show that a group of individuals, whose purposes were contrary to those of the Anti-Defamation League, had engaged in a plot to bomb the homes of numerous Hollywood residents. The Anti-Defamation League also has in its possession the names of the plotters and a copy of the original instructions with regard to the proposed bombings. Winchell stated that this information could be turned over to the Department of Justice.

This information was also verified upon the Director's instructions by the Los Angeles office and reference was made to the extortion case which had been referred to the Los Angeles office on October 25, 1937 concerning UNKNOWN SUBJECT alias "Pro-Hitlers", EDGIE CANTOR - Victim, Extortion. This extortion case is apparently the background which served as the basis of Walter Winchell's statement over the Sunday night broadcast. The extortion case pertained to a postal card mailed at Los Angeles, California on October 27, 1937 to Louis Cantor, urging him and George Jessel to watch out at the banquet to be given in Cantor's honor.

The Los Angeles office was advised on November 1, 1937, in view of the fact that it had taken no action on the above information to refer the matter to the Postal authorities, inasmuch as the letter was transmitted through the United States Mails. 9-9702-16

comedian. This information was disclosed by the Los Angeles County District Attorney's office to whom the complaints were referred approximately a month ago. The article further indicates that the District Attorney's office is presently conducting an undercover investigation relative to the matter and is maintaining a surveillance of the leaders of the plot.

b7c Agents [redacted] are at the present time in Chicago where they will complete the examination of the records of the Anti-Defamation League. All information is sent to the central headquarters of the Anti-Defamation League which is located in Chicago and Agents [redacted] have been instructed to run out all information which was referred to in Walter Winchell's broadcast and, if available, to obtain the official documents to which Winchell referred.

At that time the communication had been received from the local Post Office Inspector inasmuch as it was not a violation of any postal regulations. This communication is being furnished for the completion of the Bureau's files, with the request that it be processed for fingerprints and that the handwriting be checked against the anonymous handwriting file maintained by the Bureau.

This communication is known to have been handled by BENJAMIN S. HILMAN and his fingerprint impressions, on a civil identification card, are being forwarded with this communication. They should be retained in the Bureau's civil files after their use in this examination.

The envelope is made up of plain white paper and measures 3.89x7.16". The letter was written on a sheet of folded correspondence paper which when unfolded measures 6.97x10.47". The letter and the address on the envelope were written in longhand with blue ink.

No comparison could be made with the writing on the postal card previously submitted as the card was handprinted.

The printing at the end of the letter is done with a rubber stamp set of the kind sold by the Superior Type Company, 3940 Ravenswood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. The name of the company as it appears on the cover of a set is "T. S. T. Co." This type is used in the Handy Type Set and the Prentice Rubber Type Set and may be used in other sets produced by this company.

The handwriting on this letter was searched through the anonymous letter file but no identification was effected. A photographic copy will be placed in this file and if an identification is made in the future your office will be notified.

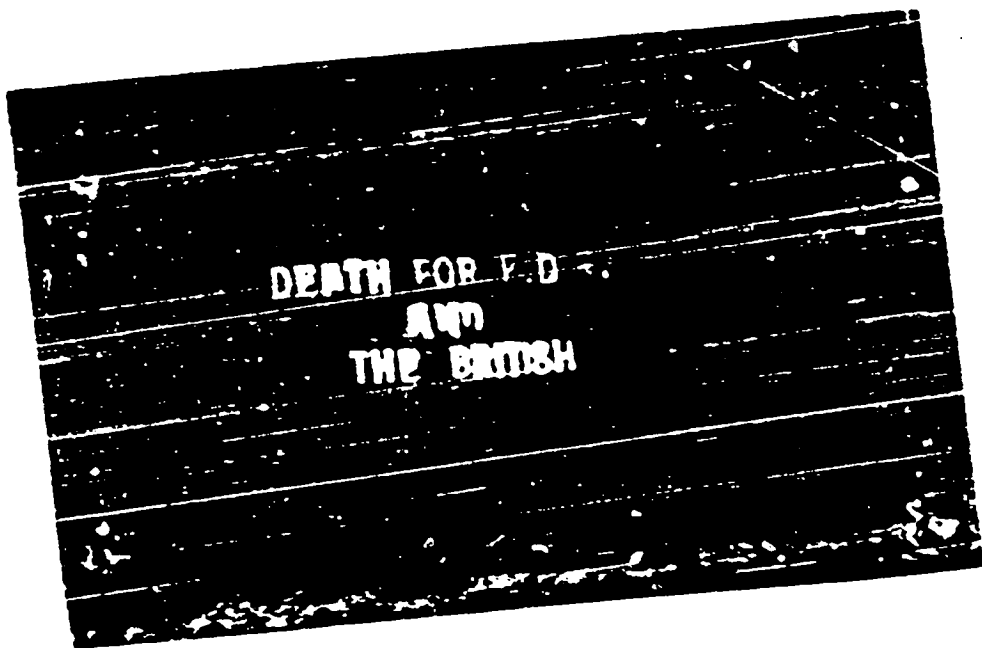

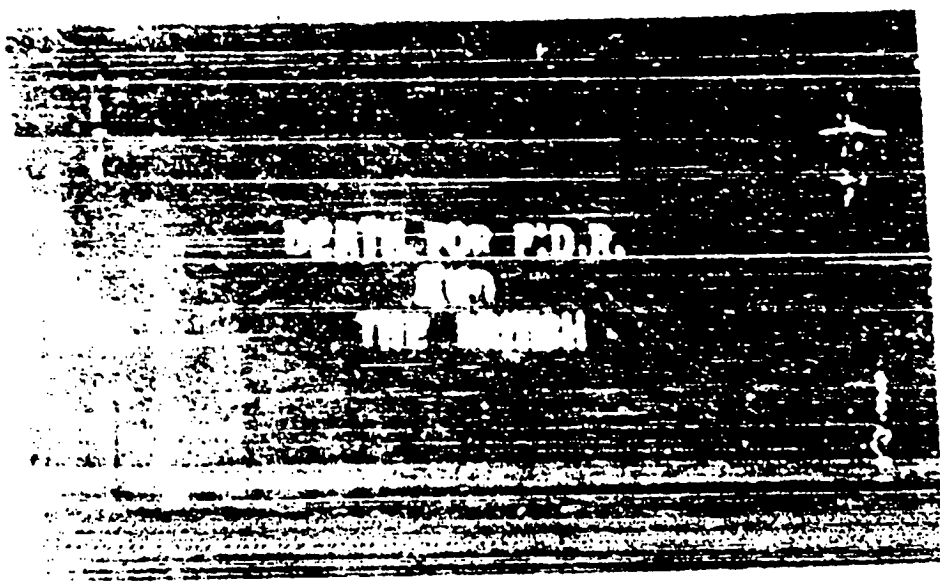

It was concluded that the lettering set used in preparing specimen Q2 in the instant case is of the kind manufactured by the Falton Specialty Company, 82 Falton Street, Elizabeth, New Jersey and is called the "Ben Franklin Rubber Type Set #24X". The rubber type impressions on Q2 in the instant case were not made by the same rubber type set used in making the rubber type impressions on specimen Q3 in Bureau File #9-1171.




