

### **Lumberton/Robeson County, North Carolina**

The following profile contains information on demographics, political figures, programs, crime, drug use, drug trafficking, and enforcement statistics.

#### **Demographics**

- Lumberton Population (1999 estimate): 19,340<sup>1</sup>
- Robeson County Population (2000 estimate): 111,242<sup>2</sup>
- ➤ Robeson County Race/Ethnicity (1998 estimate): 40.7% American Indian, Eskimo, or Aleut; 34.4% white; 24.4% black; 1.1% Hispanic; 0.4% Asian/Pacific Islander<sup>3</sup>
- Persons below poverty level, Robeson County (1995): 24.1%
- ➤ Children below poverty level, Robeson County (1995): 33.0%

#### **Programs/Initiatives**

- ➤ The City of Lumberton is a Weed and Seed site.<sup>4</sup>
- ➤ Youth Out of the Education Mainstream (YOEM) Program<sup>5</sup>
  This program, which is run by North Carolina's Center for the Prevention of School Violence, has been implemented in sites across the State including Lumberton. This initiative focuses on at-risk youth who are truant, dropouts, fearful of attending school, suspended or expelled, or in need of help reintegrating into mainstream schools from juvenile detention and correctional settings.

#### **Crime and Drug-Related Crime**

- During 1999, there were 2,852 crime index offenses known to the police in Lumberton. 122 of these offenses were robberies.<sup>6</sup>
- ➤ In 1998, there were 2,259 crime index offenses known to Lumberton police.<sup>7</sup>

### **Enforcement** <sup>11</sup>

As of October 31, 1999, there were a total of 73 full-time law enforcement employees in Lumberton. 63 of these employees were officers, and 10 were civilians.

➤ At this same time, Robeson County had 209 full-time law enforcement employees, 91 of which were officers.
