## **Trenton, New Jersey**

The following profile contains information on demographics, political figures, programs, crime, drug use, drug trafficking, and enforcement statistics.

### Demographics<sup>1</sup>

- > Population (2000 Census): 85,403
- Race/Ethnicity (2000 Census): 32.6% white; 52.1% black/African American; 0.4% American Indian/Alaska Native; 0.8% Asian; 0.2% Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander; 10.8% other race; 3.2% two or more races; 21.5% Hispanic/Latino (of any race)
- > Trenton is located in Mercer County.

### **Programs/Initiatives**

- Office on Substance Abuse Prevention and Education (OSAPE)<sup>5</sup> OSAPE coordinates all substance abuse prevention education activities and services for Trenton.
- Trenton Municipal Alliance Committee (TMAC)<sup>6</sup>
  TMAC provides support to a coalition of individuals and organizations concerned with alcohol, tobacco, and other drug issues. TMAC sponsors community meetings and awareness activities throughout the year.
- Trenton Redirecting Youth Prevention Education Program (TRYPEP)<sup>7</sup>
  TRYPEP is an early intervention program specifically designed to reduce early first use of substances. As part of the program, adjudicated youth and high school students are trained to become peer mentors to elementary school students.

#### **Federal Funding**

- ➤ Drug-Free Communities Support Program<sup>8</sup>
  There have been no Drug-Free Communities Support Program grantees in Trenton.
- Executive Office for Weed and Seed<sup>9</sup>
  The Northwest and Southeast sections of Trenton have been designated Weed and Seed sites.
- ➤ FY 2002 Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) Discretionary Funds awarded to agencies/organizations in Trenton: <sup>10</sup>
  - Center for Mental Health Services: \$7,754,412
  - Center for Substance Abuse Prevention: \$437,628
  - Center for Substance Abuse Treatment: \$1,422,126
- ➤ Trenton did not receive any funding through the FY 2003 Office of Justice Programs Drug Court Grant Program.<sup>11</sup>

- ➤ Trenton did not receive any funding in 2002 from the Department of Justice's Office of Community Oriented Policing Services Methamphetamine Grant. <sup>12</sup>
- > FY 2002 Office of Justice Programs and Office of Community Oriented Policing Services grant amounts received in Trenton: 13
  - Discretionary \$56,463,154
  - Formula \$46,319,020
- ➤ Trenton did not receive any funding through the FY 2001 Housing and Urban Development Federally-Assisted Low Income Housing Drug Elimination Grant.<sup>14</sup>

## **Crime and Drug-Related Crime**

➤ During 2002, there were 6,310 index offenses known to police in Trenton. <sup>15</sup>

#### Juveniles

➤ Approximately 6.2% of Mercer County middle school students reported past year marijuana use. 17

➤ Approximately 4.1% of Mercer County middle school students surveyed in 2001 reported being drunk or high at school.<sup>18</sup>

#### **Enforcement**

➤ There were 423 full-time police employees in Trenton in 2002 (452 officers and 62 civilians). <sup>19</sup>

#### **Trafficking and Seizures**

➤ Trenton is used as a drug distribution center for smaller cities in and outside the state. <sup>20</sup>

#### **Courts**

➤ Drug Courts<sup>21</sup>

As of September 2003, there were 2 drug courts in existence in Trenton. One drug court has been operating for more than 2 years, while the other was recently implemented. There were no additional drug courts being planned in Trenton at that time.

#### Corrections

Approximately 4% (1,197 offenders) of the offenders in New Jersey correctional institutions on January 8, 2001 had Mercer County as their county of commitment.<sup>22</sup>

#### **Consequences of Use**

➤ Preliminary data indicate that there were 28 drug-related deaths and 24 alcohol-related deaths in Mercer County during 2001.<sup>23</sup>

#### **Treatment**

➤ There were 1,437 admissions to treatment in Trenton during 2002.<sup>24</sup>

- Approximately 68% of those receiving treatment in Mercer County during 2002 had previously received treatment. Forty percent of those being treated had referred themselves to treatment and 21% were referred through the criminal justice system. Approximately 75% of those admitted to treatment reported that they did not have health insurance.<sup>25</sup>
- ➤ In 2002, 34% of the substance abuse treatment admissions in Mercer County had heroin as the primary drug of abuse. <sup>26</sup>
