2003 Shirley Jefferies Award Recipient Suzanne Anderson



Introduced to music early in life, both sides of Suzanne's Anderson's family have strong backgrounds in music, and she grew up in a household where playing musical instruments was encouraged. Anderson began piano lessons in the first grade and

continued through high school, entering in competitions and accompanying groups. Awarded a scholarship to Wartburg College in Waverly, Iowa in 1988, Anderson studied music therapy with an emphasis on piano, graduating in 1992.

Following a six-month internship at the University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston, Texas, Anderson was hired as a music therapist at the VA Medical Center in Knoxville, Iowa. For almost eleven years, she has worked as a creative arts therapist, bringing to countless veterans her love of music and strong belief in its ability to heal.

Anderson's involvement with the National Veterans Creative Arts Festival began in 1993 when she attended the event in St. Cloud, Minn. with her supervisor, Shirley Jefferies. Then National Advisor of the Festival, Jeffries encouraged her to prepare the Knoxville veterans to enter the competition and perform in the Festival stage show.

Over the years, veterans from the Knoxville facility have performed dance routines and vocal and instrumental acts for several Festival shows. Anderson's own interest and experience in musical theater has been an asset to her work in VA. She was involved with the planning of the 1994 Festival, hosted by the Knoxville VA Medical Center. During that year, Jefferies passed away, leaving Anderson and other staff of the host medical center to pick up the pieces and proceed with the plans for the Festival.

Throughout the past three years, Anderson has served as stage manager for the Festival stage show. She also accepted the responsibilities of performing arts assistant in 2000, and held the position of national dance chairperson for a total of six years. Her role this year has expanded to include planning and carrying out the specifics of the stage show. Part of this responsibility involves writing the entire technical script for lighting, audio, video, staging, emcee and special effect cues.

Suzanne Anderson has given graciously of her time, talents and experience. Her work reflects the true spirit behind the meaning of creative arts therapy – the ability to positively influence the lives of others through artistic avenues.

Shirley Jefferies was a Recreation Therapist at the Knoxville, Iowa VA Medical Center. She served as Advisor to the National Veterans Creative Arts Competition and Festival until her death in 1994. Jeffries was a vital influence to the beginnings of the program and the drive behind many of its changes and growth. She held a love for the arts and their therapeutic value in life. She has made a lasting impact on many veterans and staff members involved with the event.

The Shirley Jefferies Memorial Award began in 1994. It is presented each year to an individual who demonstrates true dedication to the National Veterans Creative Arts Festival, its goals and philosophy. Through recognition of an individual who has displayed such dedication, we pay tribute to Jeffries and also carry on her therapeutic message.


