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PERFORMANCE BASED LOGISTICS TAKES FOREFRONT

USD (AT&L) has directed the Department of the Navy to prepare and submit its PBL Implementation Plan by 01 May 02. See memo www.ar.navy.mil/reflib/021302pbl.pdf. To execute this task, DON has established a Working Group to create policy guidelines and a PBL strategy for acquisition programs. USD (AT&L) Approves of Cost As an Independent Variable (CAIV) and Spiral Development Implementation Plans

With the launching of SeaPort on 02 Apr 01, NAVSEA is in the process of re-engineering the way it procures over half a billion dollars of Professional Support Services (PSS) each year for its headquarters' Directorates, Program Executive Offices, and field activities. Through the Seaport program, NAVSEA established a faster, better, and cheaper means of procuring PSS. In less than six months, Multiple Award Contracts (MACs) were awarded to twenty-one qualified industry partners; and the website www.seaport.navy.mil/, with an operational e-business portal, was launched.
