The Bureau of Labor Statistics, the National Center for Health Statistics, and the U.S. Census Bureau offer extraordinary opportunities for postdoctoral research in mathematical statistics, information science, computer science, survey methodology, health statistics, epidemiology, and the social and behavior sciences applicable to large scale sample surveys.

Eligibility: Submit a one-page statement of research interest for competitive review to the agency where you wish to be considered. Applicants must have held a Ph.D. (or equivalent) in a relevant field for less than 3 years or completed the Ph.D. before the commencement of work as a postdoctoral researcher. United States citizenship is required.

Location: Washington, DC, area.

Duration: Two years, but can be extended with special considerations.

Salary: Starting salaries from \$52,000 to \$67,000 with adjustments depending on qualifications and experience.

Benefits: Federal health and life insurance, sick and annual leave available, 401(k) equivalent, tuition reimbursement plan, and relocation expenses paid in some cases.

Application Materials: A curriculum vitae.

Official transcripts of all graduate and undergraduate credits.

Three reference letters.

A one-page statement of research interest prepared in accordance with the guidelines given on the Web sites below.

Application Deadline: For fullest consideration, submit to agency by February 28, 2001.

Decisions will be made beginning mid-April 2001.

Applications will be accepted throughout the year until positions are filled.

Successful candidates will begin their work at a mutually agreeable date between June 1, 2001, and December 31, 2001.
