- February 20, 2002: Kick-off session, formal public meeting:
 - o Immigration and Naturalization Service Commissioner (INS) Ziglar addressed Task Force members and importance of its work to be done
 - Introduced appointed Task Force members
 - Outlined statutory requirements and the Task Force Charter
- March 5, 2002: Informational briefings Part 1:
 - o Informational briefings by the INS, Department of State, U.S. Customs Service and others on general Ports-of-Entry (POEs) familiarization and overviews

- April 2, 2002: Informational briefings, Part 2:
 - Continuation of informational briefings by INS and Task Force members on general POEs familiarization and overviews

 - Northern and Southern Land Border combined initial meeting, gathering information, requirements, organization of sub-committees and discussed POEs and Entry/Exist issues
 - Airport initial meeting, similar discussion
 - Seaport initial meeting, similar discussion held March 28, 2002
 - All determined next steps and subsequent meetings to gather more information regarding each sub-committee's area of concern and begin addressing issues
- By April 30, 2002 all sub-committees will have met at least once, others more frequently through meetings and/or conference calls. Each sub-committee is addressing the issues facing their business environment (air, land, sea) discussing ideas about how to effectively implement an entry exit system. The Chair and Executive Director of the Task Force are providing guidance and coordinating all elements throughout this process, including coordinating with appropriate foreign governments.
