Elko Field Office, 775-753-0200 3900 E. Idaho St., Elko, NV 89801

Wilson Reservoir Campground – 83 miles northwest of Elko via State Route 225 to State Route 226, the last 16 miles on gravel road. Elevation 5300 feet, 15 campsites, tables, fire rings, vault toilets, dump station, hand pump water, boat ramp fee \$2 per visit, camping fee \$4 per vehicle per night. Accessible late April through October.

North Wildhorse Campground – 70 miles north of Elko on State Route 225. Elevation 6200 feet,18 campsites, tables, fire rings, grills, three group sites, vault toilets, hand pump water, gravel roads, camping fees \$5 per vehicle per night. Open late May through October. Scenic drives and mountain biking opportunities nearby.

Zunino/Jiggs Reservoir – 30 miles southeast of Elko via State Route 227 to State Route 228. Elevation 5600 feet. Open camping on north and south shores only. Tables, grills, vault toilet in day use area, no drinking water, no fee.

Tabor Creek – Located 30 miles northwest of Wells on mostly gravel road. Elevation 6000 feet, 10 campsites, tables, fire rings, vault toilet, no drinking water, no fees. Accessible mid-April through late November. Mountain biking, hiking and fishing nearby.

Winnemucca Field Office, 775-623-1500 5100 Winnemucca Blvd. Winnemucca, NV 89445

Onion Valley Reservoir – 28 miles south of Denio Junction. Six semi-primitive campsites for tents or tent trailers, two vault toilets, fire grills, tables, no fee. Accessible mid-June through mid-October.

Water Canyon – Secluded area located 20 minutes south of Winnemucca offering picnicking, birdwatching and primitive camping. Year-round stream provides a lush riparian environment. No facilities, no fee.

Black Rock Desert – Just north of the rural town of Gerlach, on State Route 447, two hours from Reno. Vast white playa with primitive camping and outstanding opportunities for solitude. Playa is impassable when wet or during inclement weather.

Carson City Field Office, 775-885-6000 5665 Morgan Mill Road, Carson City, NV 89701

Indian Creek Recreation Area – 7 miles north of Markleeville, Calif., on Highway 89. 19 sites for RVs or tents. A second area has 10 sites for tents only, features grills, tables and tent pads. Fees: \$10 per night for main campground; \$8 per night for tent walk-in sites. Water, restrooms and a dump station. Open May through October.

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Walker Lake Recreation Area – 15 miles north of Hawthorne on U.S. 95. Sportsman's Beach offers 40 sites, tables, vault toilets, fire rings and boat launch. \$6 per night for developed sites and \$4 per night for undeveloped sites. Other sites along the lake include: The Cove – camping; Twenty- Mile Beach – camping, fishing and boating; Tamarack – camping, day use and boating; East Shore – camping, day use and boating.

Sand Mountain Recreation Area – 25 miles east of Fallon on U.S. 50. Large sand dune area open for off-highway vehicle use. Designated camping near base of Sand Mountain. Vault toilet, no water and no fees.

Cleve Creek Campground – 12 miles north of U.S. Hwy. 6-50 in north Spring Valley. Elevation 6233 feet. Travel trailers 24 ft. maximum. Good stream fishing with a variety of undeveloped campsites. Restrooms and no fees.

Gap Mountain Campground – West of Nevada Hwy. 318 (turn at Nye milepost 12.4) on the southern access road to the Kirsch Wildlife Area. Elevation 5220 feet. Camping is primitive with no facilities and no fees.

Goshute Canyon – Primitive campground located near the lower end of Goshute Creek in the Cherry Creek Range. Elevation 6230 feet. No facilities, high-clearance vehicle recommended. No fees.

Illipah Reservoir – 37 miles west of Ely on U.S. Hwy 50. Turn at the highway sign for Illipah Reservoir and continue 0.1 mile to a road junction, turn left and continue 1.3 miles to the campground. Elevation 6840 feet. No fee.

Meadow Valley Campground – ½ mile south of Spring Valley State Park, near Pioche. Elevation 5740 feet. Very secluded with fishing and hiking opportunities. Camping is primitive with no facilities or fees.

Las Vegas Field Office, 702-647-5000 4765 W. Vegas Drive, Las Vegas, NV 89108

13 Mile Campground – Located off State Route 159 at the 13 mile marker, west of Las Vegas at Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area. The campground includes 55 individual sites, 24 walk-in sites and 10 group sites. \$10 per night per vehicle. Restrooms, water, grills and tables.

Battle Mountain Field Office, 775-635-4000 50 Bastian Road, Battle Mountain, NV 89820

Hickison Petroglyph Recreation Area – Just off State Route 50, 24 miles east of Austin. Year-round use, 16 campsites, day-use area, two vault toilets, grills, tables and trash cans. No fee. Very scenic interpretive trail.

Mill Creek Recreation Area – 24 miles south of Battle Mountain on State Route 305. Year-round use, 11 tent camp sites, three RV sites, two accessible sites, accessible vault toilet, day-use area, tables and grills. No fee.

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
