ERRATUM TO AUTOMATED MARITIME TELECOMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM SPECTRUM AUCTION SCHEDULED FOR SEPTEMBER 15, 2004

CORRECTION TO NOTICE AND FILING REQUIREMENTS, MINIMUM OPENING BIDS, UPFRONT PAYMENTS AND OTHER AUCTION PROCEDURES

On May 28, 2004, the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau (the "Bureau") released the *Auction No. 57 Procedures Public Notice* setting forth the terms and conditions to govern the auction of 20 licenses in the Automated Maritime Telecommunications System (AMTS) in the 217/219 MHz bands - Auction No. 57. In section I(B)(5), the Bureau discussed the due diligence steps that interested applicants ought to perform in connection with determining, among other things, pending and future judicial proceedings that may relate to particular applicants or incumbent licensees, or the licenses available in Auction No. 57. Footnote 53 provided citations to several pending judicial proceedings that may relate to particular applicants or incumbent licensees, or the licenses available in Auction No. 57.
