MICHAEL WILHELM NAMED CHIEF OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY AND CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE DIVISION OF THE WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATIONS BUREAU

Washington, DC – John Muleta, Chief of the FCC's Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, has announced that Michael Wilhelm will become Chief of the Bureau's Public Safety and Critical Infrastructure Division.

He received a Bachelor of Philosophy degree in Communications from the University of Detroit, a Masters of Arts degree in Communications from the University of Michigan, and a J.D. degree, with high honors, from the University of Florida Law School, where he served on the Editorial Board of the Law Review and was a member of the *Order of the Coif*.
