

SUBJECT: Anthrax Vaccine Immunization Program Resumption

On December 23, 2003, I conveyed the Deputy Secretary's decision that DoD will stop giving anthrax vaccinations until clarification of legal issues raised by a preliminary injunction of December 22, 2003, by the United States District Court for the District of Columbia against the current operation of the Anthrax Vaccine Immunization Program (AVIP). Although the litigation has not been finally resolved, today the Court issued a stay of that preliminary injunction. The Department of Defense remains convinced that the AVIP complies with all legal requirements, and there is now no judicial restraint on AVIP implementation. Therefore, you should immediately resume the anthrax vaccination program.
