12 FAM 200 PROTECTION AND INVESTIGATIONS

12 FAM 210 PROTECTION OF SECRETARY OF STATE, FOREIGN DIGNITARIES, AND FOREIGN MISSIONS IN UNITED STATES

12 FAM 211 ORGANIZATION AND PURPOSE

(TL:DS-39; 8-15-94)

a. The Office of Protection (DS/DSS/P) manages the Department of State's protective security program which reports to the Director of the Diplomatic Security Service (DS/DSS). (See 1 FAM 560.)

- b. DS/DSS/P establishes and maintains effective liaison with:
- (1) Other Department elements;
- (2) Appropriate federal, State, and local government agencies;
- (3) Foreign governments; and

(4) Their diplomatic and official representatives in matters affecting the Department's protective responsibilities.

- c. DS/DSS/P is responsible for:
- (1) The Secretary of State's protective detail;
- (2) Dignitary protection; and
- (3) Protective liaison.

12 FAM 212 AUTHORITIES

(TL:DS-32; 8-5-93)

a. Under the Foreign Relations Authorization Act of 1985 (22 U.S.C. 2709(a)(3)(B) and (C)) and the Omnibus Diplomatic Security and Antiterrorism Act of 1986 as codified at 22 U.S.C. 4804(3)(B) (Pub.L. 99-399, Title I, section 105, August 27, 1986, 100 Stat. 856), DS special agents and security officers are authorized to perform protective functions, in the United

States and abroad, directly related to maintaining the security and safety of the Secretary, the Deputy Secretary, and other official representatives of the U.S. Government, as well as members of their immediate families.

b. Under the Foreign Relations Authorization Act of 1985 (22 U.S.C. 2709(a)(3)(A) and (D)) and the Omnibus Diplomatic Security and Antiterrorism Act of 1986 as codified at 22 U.S.C. 4804(3)(A) (Pub.L. 99-399, Title I, section 105, August 27, 1986, 100 Stat. 856), DS special agents protect the security and safety of official representatives of a foreign government and other distinguished visitors while in the United States, and protect foreign missions and international organizations in the United States.

c. Under the Foreign Missions Act as codified at 22 U.S.C. 4314 (Pub.L. 99-93, Title I, section 126(a), 99 Stat. 417), authorized appropriations fund the Foreign Consulate Program.

d. Sections 202(8) and 208(a) of Title 3, U.S.C., as amended, authorizes the International Organizations Reimbursement Program, which disburses funds in the New York City area in connection with United Nations activities. Executive Order 12478 transferred this specific reimbursement authority to the Secretary of State.

e. Section 202(10) of Title 3, U.S.C. as amended, authorizes reimbursement for visits of foreign government officials to metropolitan areas (other than the District of Columbia) where there are located twenty or more consular or diplomatic missions staffed by accredited personnel, including protection for motorcades and at other places associated with such visits, when such officials are in the United States to conduct official business with the U.S. Government.

12 FAM 213 REIMBURSEMENTS

(TL:DS-39; 8-15-94)

The Protective Liaison Division (DS/P/PL) administers two parallel financial reimbursement programs which compensate State and local law enforcement authorities or private security organizations for extraordinary protective services, which they have been authorized to provide for foreign missions and officials in the United States. (See section 212, paragraphs d and e.)

12 FAM 213.1 Foreign Consulate Program

(TL:DS-39; 8-15-94)

The consulate reimbursement program compensates U.S. local jurisdictions for extraordinary protection provided to foreign diplomats and their facilities in cities throughout the United States.

12 FAM 213.2 International Organizations Program

(TL:DS-39; 8-15-94)

The international organizations reimbursement program disburses funds to New York City and other New York City area police departments for the protection of foreign missions and officials accredited to United Nations missions and for the protection of visiting foreign dignitaries, when the visit involves diplomatic activities connected with the United Nations.

12 FAM 213.3 Foreign Government Officials Visits Program

(TL:DS-39; 8-15-94)

This program reimburses designated U.S. local jurisdictions for extraordinary protection provided to visiting foreign government officials when such officials are in the United States to conduct official business with the U.S. Government.

12 FAM 214 PROCEDURES

(TL:DS-39; 8-15-94)

12 FAH-2 entitled "Protection" (designated LOU) contains all procedures for the protection of the Secretary of State, foreign dignitaries, and protective liaison functions. These procedures are derived from section 12 FAM 212 authorities and are mandatory requirements for all DS special agents and security professionals in the performance of their official protective responsibilities.
