In it's current state the Can-Spam Act will punish those of us who are honest And law abiding who conduct business and communication on line. We do not Spam. We have established are own opt-in list, those who requested our email, newsletters, articles, updates, and questionnaires. We provide people a chance to be removed from our email list. Many of us have set up register where a listing of all those requesting to be removed are kept. That way we can not be blamed if they claim we are still sending them Emails.

So why should we be punished by your Can-Spam Act? I believe if it is approves in it's current state one of two things will transpire:

- 1. Many of us will cease doing business on the Internet. This will result is loss of income, and that means less in the amount of taxes collected the Federal and State Governments will receive.
- 2. Many of us may be forced to move to another country and aim our business at people in other countries.

Since the major part of Spam or Bulk Emails come from Internet Service Providers in other countries they should refuse to forward them. They should keep a file of the bulk Mailers.
