SECTION III: STAFF SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

DEFINITION OF STAFF SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

The definition of STAFF SEXUAL MISCONDUCT is based on "Training for Investigators of Staff Sexual Misconduct," prepared by the National Institute of Corrections. STAFF SEXUAL MISCONDUCT includes any behavior or act of a sexual nature directed toward a juvenile or youthful offender by an employee, counselor, instructor, volunteer, official visitor, or agency representative.

- · Consensual or non-consensual sexual acts;
- Intentional touching of the genitalia, anus, groin, breast, inner thigh, or buttocks with the intent to abuse, arouse, or gratify sexual desire; or
- Completed, attempted, threatened, or requested sexual acts; or
- Incidents of indecent exposure, invasion of privacy for sexual gratification, or staff voyeurism.

DEFINITION OF STAFF SEXUAL HARASSMENT

The definition of STAFF SEXUAL HARASSMENT was also developed by the National Institute of Corrections. STAFF SEXUAL HARASSMENT includes repeated verbal statements or comments of a sexual nature to a juvenile or youthful offender by employee, counselor, instructor, volunteer, official visitor, or agency representative.
