FCC PROPOSES STATUTORY MAXIMUM FORFEITURE OF \$55,000 AGAINST CAPSTAR, A SUBSIDIARY OF CLEAR CHANNEL, FOR APPARENT VIOLATIONS OF INDECENCY RULE

Washington, D.C.- The Federal Communications Commission today issued a Notice of Apparent Liability for Forfeiture against Capstar TX Limited Partnership for broadcast of indecent material over Stations WAVW(FM), Stuart, Florida, and WCZR(FM), Vero Beach, Florida.

Specifically, the broadcasts contained a dialogue between the hosts and a man and a woman while they were engaging in actual or simulated sexual intercourse.

The Commission proposed the maximum forfeiture permitted by law of \$27,500 for each of the two broadcasts, for a total forfeiture amount of \$55,000. It proposed the maximum statutory forfeiture amount due to the history of indecent broadcasts by other licensees controlled by Clear Channel Communications, Inc., Capstar's parent corporation.
