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
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The FDA Advisory Committees Information Line provides public access by telephone to the Federal Advisory Committees process in a convenient and timely manner.

The toll-free number is listed in telephone directories across the country so callers can learn, among other things, when and where upcoming meetings will be held, how to request documents under the Freedom of Information Act, how to nominate individuals to the advisory committees, and how to reach committee staffers.

Callers hear a recorded message providing general information and a menu directing them to choose the Center for which they seek information. Additional menus assist in selecting the type of information needed. Phone numbers of committee staff are included in the messages so that callers can call the appropriate office if additional information is needed.

Frequent callers who wish to learn dates and locations for a particular meeting can bypass the general menu and information by pressing a 10 digit identification number as soon as the line is answered. An identification number has been assigned to each committee and will appear in each Federal Register notice for the committee. The codes are listed below:
