## Questions for Participant Response

- 1. Medicaid is moving from a regulatory, process-centered model of service delivery to a new paradigm in which the **individual is placed at the center of the design process.** How can the Federal government facilitate this process?
- 2. This necessitates a change in the way we approach the development of waiver programs. A good example of this is the self-direction that is featured in the Independence Plus (IP) initiative. How should we move to incorporate certain IP elements, such as quality, into the waiver program as a whole?
- 3. How should the redesign of the waiver program incorporate quality and person-centered concepts at the front-end of HCBS program design? What factors should CMS look for when reviewing a state's request for a waiver?
- 4. CMS reviews the way each state operates its waiver before renewing the program. What factors should CMS consider in this review? Are there features that should characterize a well-run waiver? Are there features that should act as "red flags" to warn CMS that a waiver program does not serve the needs of enrolled individuals and their families?
- 5. When an individual is given the <u>right</u> to direct service planning and delivery, that person also has the <u>responsibility</u> to do so wisely. What supports should we put in place to assist an individual in carrying out this responsibility?
- 6. What further development is needed to ensure that people are integrated into their communities?
