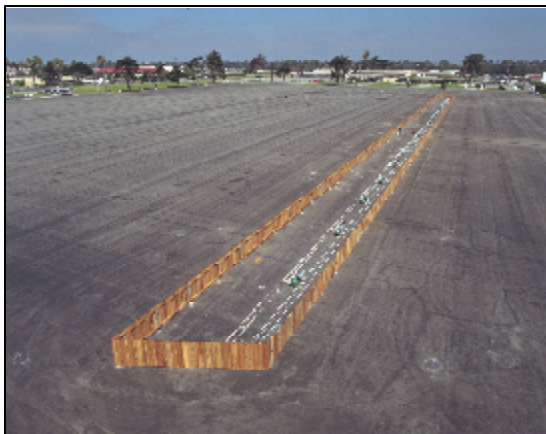

What is the NFESC BAA Program?

The Naval Facilities Engineering Service Center (NFESC) Broad Agency Announcement (BAA) program is a streamlined and flexible contracting alternative. Authorized in the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR), the BAA program enables the Navy to conduct a search for and identify innovative environmental technologies and methodologies in either applied research (Category 6.2), advanced technology development (Category 6.3A), or demonstration and validation (Category 6.3B).

The technology or methodology should provide a solution to a problem, or provide a better, faster, or cheaper application in one of the following topic areas:

- Environmental Assessment, Restoration, and Cleanup
- Conservation of Natural Resources
- Munitions & Explosives of Concern
- Pollution Prevention
- Environmental Compliance

Who can submit a technology/methodology for review?

The Navy's BAA solicits abstracts from academia, private vendors, Government contractors, and national laboratories.

How to vendors submit a technology/methodology for consideration?

Requirements and instructions on submitting an abstract for consideration are outlined in the BAA. This solicitation is updated, published, and re-advertised on the FedBizOpps website annually in October. What is required from the vendor?

Abstracts are completed and submitted on-line using a simple and easy to follow form that is available on the Navy's BAA web page. Vendors must address all of the evaluation criteria noted in the BAA. The evaluation criteria include: Scientific/technical merits; project objectives; offeror's capabilities, experience, and key personnel that are integral factors in achieving the proposed objectives; and estimated cost to perform the work.

Abstracts are thoroughly evaluated by a technical evaluation board of NFESC engineers and scientists. A technology's eligibility is based on its ability to meet the criteria stated in the BAA. Abstracts will be evaluated on their own merits and will not be evaluated against each other. Abstracts that are accepted into the program will be posted on the on the Defense Environmental Network & Information eXchange (DENIX) web site and are available for contract award throughout the Department of Defense (DOD).

Who can use the BAA?

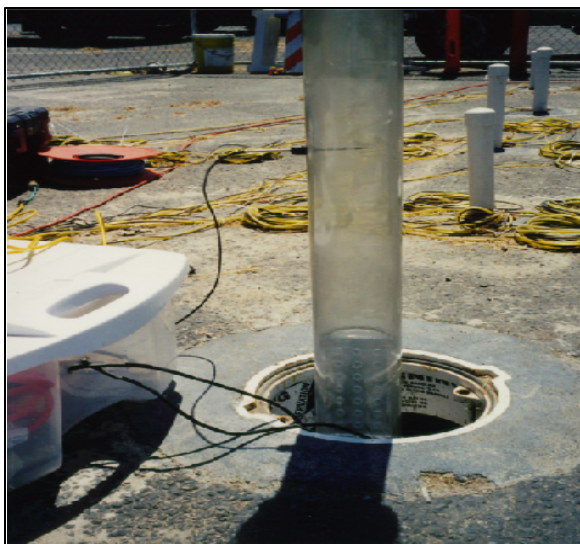
Any DOD activity that is interested in funding the development or demonstration of an eligible innovative technology, can use the BAA Program for contract work.

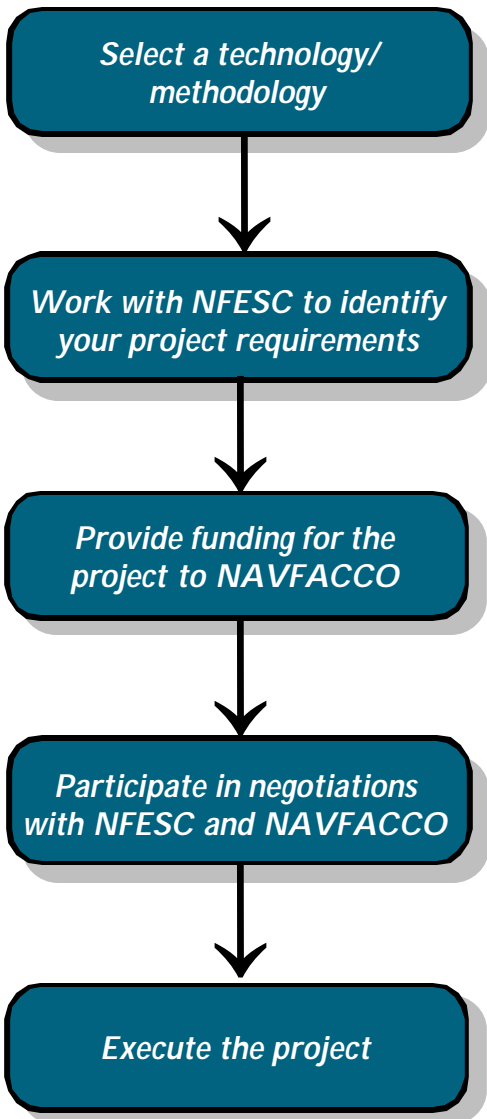
Where to find a list of available technologies?

All eligible BAA abstracts are posted on the Internet through DENIX, a controlled-access web site. Remedial Program Managers (RPMs) and specified DOD individuals can access this site and perform a keyword search to view a technology or methodology abstract.
