Carbon County Enters Stage 1 Fire Restrictions

Stage 1 fire restrictions will go into effect on private, state and Bureau of Land Management lands in Carbon County on Friday, August 20.

Stage 1 restrictions are already in place on private, state and BLM lands in Stillwater, Musselshell, Treasure and Yellowstone counties. In Sweet Grass County, BLM lands are under Stage 1 restrictions, and private and state lands are under Stage 2 restrictions. There are no restrictions on Forest Service lands in any of these counties.

Under Stage 1, fires are permitted only within developed recreation sites, and smoking is allowed only in areas cleared of flammable materials.

Stage 2 restrictions prohibit any open burning, including campfires. Smoking is allowed only in areas cleared of all flammable materials. Motorized vehicles must stay on designated roads and trails. Operating an internal combustion engine, welding, or using explosives is prohibited between 1 p.m. and 1 a.m.

Exemptions for both Stage 1 and Stage 2 include fires fueled solely by liquid petroleum or LPG, or other activities for which there is a permit or written authorization.

An exemption does not absolve an individual or organization from liability or responsibility for any fire started by the exempted activity.

When working and recreating outdoors, please continue to use caution and honor restrictions to decrease the chance of more human-caused fires and avoid resource and property damage. Anyone who causes a wildland fire intentionally or through negligence may be held accountable for damage and suppression costs.

Even in areas not under Stage 1 or Stage 2 restrictions, a permit is required for any open burning other than campfires. Additional restrictions may also exist in certain areas. Before burning such things as slash piles, ditches, or fields, please contact your local fire department or sheriff's office for more information and to obtain any necessary permits.
