Comment Sought for Bentonite Mine Environmental Assessment

ALZADA – The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Miles City Field Office and the Montana Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) are seeking public review and comment on an Environmental Assessment (EA) and a Finding of No Significant Impact for a proposed bentonite mine plan amendment.

The BLM and DEQ will accept comments on the jointly prepared document for a30-day period ending October 13, 2004.

American Colloid Company submitted a proposal to amend its bentonite mining plan located near Alzada, in Carter County.

The amendment proposes adding 1,487 acres to the 3,600 acres already under permit with the State of Montana. According to the proposal, 686 acres would be disturbed by mining of which 205 acres are federal lands managed by the BLM.
