Montana to Receive \$16,681,936 from Interior Under Federal Payment in Lieu of Taxes Program

Secretary of the Interior Gale A. Norton today announced that Montana will receive \$16,681,936 under the Payment In Lieu of Taxes Act to compensate county governments whose jurisdictions contain tax-exempt federal lands.

"These important dollars help states offset the loss of tax revenues to counties that contain federal lands," Norton said. "This money helps pay for essential services such as firefighting, search-and-rescue operations, and a host of other badly needed on-the-ground services."

The money distributed to Montana will go to 56 counties eligible under the PILT program for tax revenue lost because of the federal land in their jurisdiction. The counties receiving the largest payments are Ravalli, Flathead, and Lewis and Clark.
