Instructions for Student

An eligible educational institution, such as a college or university, in which you are enrolled and an insurer who makes reimbursements or refunds of qualified tuition and related expenses to you, must furnish this statement to you. You, or the person who may claim you as a dependent, may be able to take **either** the tuition and fees deduction or claim an education credit on Form 1040 or 1040A for the qualified tuition and related expenses that were actually paid in 2004. The amount shown in box 1 or 2 may represent an amount other than the amount actually paid in 2004. Your institution must include its name, address, and information contact telephone number on this statement. It may also include contact information for a service provider. Although the service provider may be able to answer certain questions about the statement, **do not** contact them or the filer for explanations of the requirements for (and how to figure) any allowable tuition and fees deduction or education credit that you may claim. For more information about the deduction or credit, see **Pub. 970**, Tax Benefits for Education, **Form 8863**, Education Credits, and the Form 1040 or 1040A instructions.

Box 1. Shows the total payments received for qualified tuition and related expenses less any related reimbursements or refunds.

Box 2. Shows the total amounts billed for qualified tuition and related expenses less any related reductions in charges.
