## Don't' delay your client's refund

There have been significant changes at the IRS this year. Some involve changes to where returns should be filed. The correct site to file a return can be found in the "Where to File" instructions for both Individual and Business returns. About 10% of the approximately 14 million business returns the IRS has received so far this year were mailed to IRS centers not in the "Where to File" directory. Generally, business returns should be filed at the IRS centers in Cincinnati, Ohio, or Ogden, Utah. Individual returns are also being mailed in significant numbers to the wrong IRS center. All of these misdirected returns cause possible delays in processing and the issuance of any refunds. It also results in additional processing costs for the United States Government.
