## Q1. Why did AoA and CMS decide to fund the next 12 highest-ranked FY 2003 Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) grant applications and not offer a new grant solicitation in FY 2004?

In the FY 2003, we received many applications that merited funding, but could not be funded in FY 2003 because of limited funding. In the 2003 HHS press release dated September 22, 2003, we noted that additional grants might be funded in fiscal year 2004, subject to availability of funds.
