

Hepatitis D - Clinical Features

Coinfection

- -severe acute disease
- -low risk of chronic infection

Superinfection

- -usually develop chronic HDV infection
- -high risk of severe chronic liver disease



Hepatitis D Virus Modes of Transmission

- Percutanous exposures
 - -injecting drug use
- Permucosal exposures
 - -sex contact



Time after Exposure




HBV - HDV Superinfection Typical Serologic Course
