Performance-Based Service Acquisition (PBSA) Training

PBSA was introduced by Dr. Gansler's memo of 5 April 2000. It established a 50% minimum of service acquisitions, measured in dollars and actions to be performance-based by 2005. Navy Training Product – *Turbo Streamliner, Version 2*

Turbo Streamliner was developed in 1996 to assist the acquisition community in preparing performance-based solicitations. Version 2 has been totally reorganized by functional areas. Many of the topics can be accessed from multiple functional areas or from one of several indexes. The emphasis in these topics is on best practices, actions to avoid, sample language and related references and resources. All topics from Version 1 has been refreshed and reoriented toward the RFP developer.
