FOOTNOTES

- /a/ The State of Utah was paid \$50 million under the Utah School and Lands Exchange Act of 1998 (PL 105-335). This was a one-time payment made upon completion of all conveyances covered by the Act.
- /b/ Funded from recreation fees and demonstration site collections to support public lands and recreation. Other recreation obligations are included in management of land resources.
- /c/ Public Law 105-263 authorizes the sale of 27,000 acres in Clark County, Nevada, with the proceeds distributed as follows: 5 percent for education in the State of Nevada; 10 percent to the Southern Nevada Water Authority; and 85 percent for the acquisition of environmentally sensitive lands in Nevada; capital improvements to designated areas in Clark county; development of parks, trails, etc.; and BLM costs incurred for arranged sales and exchanges.
- /d/ Used to identify potential hazardous waste locations and to restore known hazardous waste sites.
