## Explanatory notes by jurisdiction

Because many States update their population counts, the January 1, 1995, numbers may differ from those previously published for December 31, 1994.

## Federal

The decrease in persons under supervision in 1995 resulted from a review of the parole statistical database, which identified and closed case records that had been coded incorrectly.

Entries do not include reinstatements and inactive parole cases (table 6.4).

Detailed data are not provided for Hispanic origin (table 6.6).

Of the 2,513 parolees on post-conviction home confinement, approximately $70 \%$ are electronically monitored; the remainder are monitored by other means.

## Alabama

Alabama has two reporting agencies: one State and one local.

All data are estimated.
Detailed data are not provided for exits, Hispanic origin, and sentence length. In addition the State did not provide detailed data about sex and race.

Data exclude absconders and out-of-State cases.

The State reported operating intensive supervision and electronic monitoring programs but being unable to report the number of parolees in these programs (table 6.9).

## Alaska

Data are estimated for total entries and the December 31, 1995, population.

## Arizona

"Other" entries include Arizona parolees who are supervised out of State through an interstate compact agreement.

## Arkansas

All data are estimated.
Other entries include 185 parolees returned from out of State, 84 reactivated from detainer, 19 absconders in custody out of State, 481 in custody in State, and 262 transfers (table 6.4).
"Returned to incarceration - with revocation" includes parolees returned to incarceration because of technical violations; "returned to incarceration - other" includes parolees returned to incarceration with revocation because of commission of a felony; "other" exits include 153 detainers, 1 incarceration out of State, 21 out-of-State parole terminations, 2 terminated court orders, 568 absconders, and 310 absconders of parolees supervised out of State.
"Other" race includes Cuban, European, North American, Filipino, Japanese, Mexican, and Vietnamese parolees who could not be placed into any other racial group for unspecified reasons (table 6.7).

## California

California has two reporting agencies: Department of Corrections and the California Youth Authority.

Reported data do not include 17,055 absconder cases and 2,764 cases supervised out of State.
"Returned to incarceration — other" includes an unspecified number of parolees who are released because they are "returned to incarceration - with revocation;" "other" exits include 125 California Youth Authority parolees who were released from supervision with a court action pending, absent without leave at discharge, or at the end of CYA's jurisdiction (table 6.5).
"Other" races include 35,838 Hispanic parolees of unknown race (6.7).

## Colorado

Detailed data are estimated for sex, race, and Hispanic origin.
"Other" entries include interstate compact from other States (table 6.4).

Other race includes 774 Hispanic parolees of unknown race (table 6.7).

The number of parolees in the State's intensive supervision program includes an unreported number of parolees in an electronic monitoring program (table 6.9).

## Connecticut

"Discretionary release from prison" includes persons who entered parole through "reinstatement of parole" (table 6.4).
"Other" race includes 342 Hispanic parolees of unknown race (table 6.7).

## Delaware

All data are estimated.
Detailed data are not provided for entries, exits, and sentence length.

## District of Columbia

Detailed data are not provided for Hispanic origin and sentence length.
"Other" entries include 236 parole/reparole grants (with administrative status or consecutive sentence and detainers) (table 6.4).

## Florida

The December 31, 1995, population
includes all post-prison releases.

## Georgia

Detailed data are not provided for Hispanic origin (table 6.6).

Detailed data are estimated for sex, race, sentence length, "intensive supervision," and "electronic monitoring."

Because of accounting procedures and record keeping, the January 1 count, plus entries, minus exits, does not equal December 31 count (table 6.2)

## Hawaii

Detailed data are not provided for race and Hispanic origin.
"Other" supervision status includes parolees supervised by foreign agencies and parolees in institutions (table 6.3).
"Other" exits include 29 foreign and institutional exits (table 6.5).

## Idaho

Idaho has 2 reporting agencies: the State and interstate compact agencies.

Detailed data are not provided for sentence length (table 6.8).

Data are estimated for the number of parolees in the intensive supervision and electronic monitoring programs (table 6.9).

The January 1 population is reported based on the December 31, 1994, population count (table 6.2).
"Other" race includes 90 Hispanic parolees of unknown race (table 6.7).

## Illinois

Detailed data are estimated for sex, race, and Hispanic origin.
"Other" entries include transfers from another State and unspecified others (table 6.4).
"Other" exits include transfers to Apprehension Unit and unspecified others (table 6.5).
"Other" races include 2,219 Hispanic parolees of unknown race (table 6.7).
"More than a year" is reported as "1 year or more" (table 6.8).

## Indiana

Detailed data are not provided for sex, race, Hispanic origin, and sentence length.
"Other" exits include 249 parolees declared delinquent (table 6.5).

## Iowa

Detailed data are not provided for sentence length (table 6.8).
"Returned to incarceration - with new sentence" includes all parolees released because their parole is revoked; "returned to incarceration - other" includes technical violators; "other" exits include terminated cases (table 6.5).

## Kansas

Data include all post-prison supervision. The Kansas sentencing guidelines act, with its determinate sentencing structure, became effective July 1, 1993. Previously, Kansas had indeterminate sentencing. As a result, a number of entries and exits to parole (as reported) involve offenders with "guidelines" or "new law" sentences (which have determinate periods of postincarceration supervision). For this report the State is unable to differentiate movements of "old law" and "new law" offenders.

Absconders are not included in the January 1 count, December 31 count, sex, race, Hispanic origin, offense length, and supervision status. Absconders are monitored as a group separate from the regular caseload.

Detailed data are estimated for Hispanic origin (table 6.6).
"Discretionary release from prison" includes those released by the State Parole Board, releases to determinate periods of post-release supervision, and releases pursuant to the retroactive provisions of the Guidelines Act (table 6.4).
"Other" entries include 85 parolees released from pre-revocation and administrative confinement (table 6.5).
"Successful completion" includes 229 discharges and 1,245 sentence expirations; "returned to incarceration - with revocation" includes 1,577 condition violations;
"returned to incarceration - other" includes 40 administrative holdings and 87 pre-revocation confinements; "other" exits include 167 absconders who were not returned to jail or prison, 106 cases closed by warrants issued, and 168 cases involving out-of-State offenders (table 6.6).
"More than a year" includes a small number of cases with a sentence of "a year or less" (table 6.8).

## Kentucky

Detailed data are not provided for sex, race, and Hispanic origin.

## Louisiana

Detailed data are not provided for Hispanic origin (table 6.6).
"Other" exits include 132 unsatisfactory releases and 16 released by error (table 6.5).
"Other" race includes parolees of an unspecified race and an unknown number of Latinos (table 6.7).

## Maine

Maine abolished parole in 1976. The data reported represents offenders convicted prior to 1976.

The data exclude absconders.

## Maryland

Detailed data are not provided for Hispanic origin (table 6.6).
"Other" supervision status include delinquents in custody (table 6.3).
"Other" exits include unsatisfactory exits (table 6.5).

## Massachusetts

Detailed data are estimated for January 1 and December 31, 1995, population counts (table 6.2).
"Other" race includes 859 Hispanic parolees of unknown race (table 6.7).

## Michigan

Because of improvements in case-tracking procedures, these data are not comparable to data of previous years.

## Minnesota

"Other" entries include persons released to intensive community supervision programs (table 6.4).
"Other" race includes 96 Hispanic parolees of unknown race and an unspecified number of Asians (table 6.7).

## Mississippi

Data do not include 907 inactive cases.
Detailed data are not provided for Hispanic origin and sentence length.

Detailed data are estimated for race (table 6.7).
"Other" entries include 1 case from an "information lag" (table 6.4).
"Returned to incarceration - with new sentence" includes an unspecified number of parolees released because they are "returned to incarceration - with revocation" (table 6.5).

## Missouri

All data are estimated.
Detailed data are not provided for Hispanic origin (table 6.6).

## Montana

Detailed data are not provided for exits (table 6.5).

## Nevada

All data are estimated.
"Returned to incarceration - with revocation" includes an unspecified number of parolees released because they are "returned to incarceration - with new sentence" (table 6.5).

## New Hampshire

Detailed data are estimated for sex, race, and Hispanic origin.

## New Jersey

"Other" exits include 25 recalls (table 6.5).

## New Mexico

Data do not include 241 absconders or out-of-State cases.

Detailed data are estimated for sex, race, and Hispanic origin.
"Other" exits include 105 unsatisfactory discharges and 8 special action cases (table 6.5).
"Other" race includes an unspecified number of Asians and people from the Middle East (table 6.7).

Intensive supervision and electronic monitoring cases include Community Corrections cases (table 6.9).

## New York

Under legislation enacted during 1995, certain non-violent offenders may be
sentenced to parole supervision and mandated to participate in a secure, 90-day drug treatment program prior to their community supervision; "other" entries include 109 of these cases (table 6.4).
"Other" exits include 163 board action cases and 18 court-ordered exits (table 6.5).
"Other" race includes 18,852 Hispanic parolees of unknown race (table 6.7).

All newly released inmates are supervised on an intensive supervision program (in caseloads of 1 to 40) for the first 12 months after release (table 6.9).

## North Carolina

Detailed data are not provided for Hispanic origin (table 6.6).

Detailed data are estimated for supervision status (table 6.3).
"Discretionary release from prison" includes an unknown number of parolees who entered parole by "mandatory release from prison" or "reinstatement of parole;" "other" entries include an adjustment residual of 356 (table 6.4).
"Returned to incarceration - with revocation" includes an unknown number of parolees who are "returned to incarceration — with new sentence" (table 6.5).
"Other" race includes parolees of an unknown or unspecified race (table 6.7).

## Ohio

Data are not comparable to 1994 parole data because 1994 data included compact cases supervised for another State.

Detailed data are estimated for sex, race, and Hispanic origin.
"Other" entries include parolees placed out of State (table 6.4).
"Other" exits include parolees released to inactive (table 6.5).
"Other" races include 129 Hispanic parolees of unknown race (table 6.7).

## Oklahoma

"Other" race includes 96 Hispanic parolees of unknown race (table 6.7).

## Oregon

"Other" exits include discharged absconders and unspecified exits (table 6.5).
"Other" races include 1,786 Hispanic parolees of unknown race (table 6.7).

Intensive supervision program and electronic monitoring counts include both probationers and parolees (table 6.9).

## Pennsylvania

"Other" races include 2,091 Hispanic parolees of unknown race (table 6.7).

Detailed data are estimated for exits, sex, race, Hispanic origin, and status of supervision.
"Other" exits include an unspecified number of absconders and transfers (table 6.5).
"Asian/Pacific Islander" include an unspecified number of parolees whose race is other than white (table 6.7).

## Rhode Island

"Other" status of supervision includes 32 persons supervised by U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), 10 persons serving Federal sentences, 2 persons in a Federal detention facility, 1 person in the Federal witness protection program, and 20 inmates held in the Rhode Island Adult Correctional Institution on detention warrants issued by the parole board (table 6.3).
"Reinstatement of parole" includes people placed on reparoled after revocation provided they had no new sentence or a new sentence of 6 months or less (table 6.4).
"Returned to Incarceration —other" includes persons whose parole time expired while they were held on detention warrants by the parole board; "other" exits include two absconders from the State's "home confinement parole" program (table 6.5).

## South Carolina

"Other" supervision status includes 38 parolees who were supervised by INS (table 6.3).
"Asian/Pacific Islander" includes an unspecified number of parolees whose race is other than white (table 6.7).

## South Dakota

The number of parolees of Hispanic origin is estimated (table 6.6).

## Tennessee

The number of parolees in the intensive supervision program is estimated (table $6.9)$.
"Other" exits include 1,102 parolees with an expired sentence (table 6.5).

## Texas

All data are estimated.
"Active" cases exclude an estimated 1,500 cases supervised from other States (table 6.3).
"Other" entries include a decrease of out-of-State parolees supervised in Texas (table 6.4).

## Utah

"Other" exits include transfers to nonparole status or to another jurisdiction (table 6.5).

## Vermont

Detailed data are estimated for race and Hispanic origin.

## Virginia

All data are estimated.
"Other" entries include an unspecified number of persons who entered parole by transfer (table 6.4).

## Washington

All data are estimated.
"Other" exits include discharges to subsequent offense jurisdiction (table 6.5).
"Other" race include offenders of mixed and unknown race (table 6.7).

## West Virginia

West Virginia has 2 reporting agencies: the State and interstate compact agencies.

Interstate compact cases represent 16\% of West Virginia's December 31, 1995, total.
As reported, the interstate compact data are for year beginning July 1, 1994, and ending June 30, 1995.

## Wisconsin

"Other" supervision status include 195 vacating orders and 143 violation warrants issued (table 6.3).
"Other" exits include 1 voluntary return to institution and 1 modified court order (table 6.5).

Intensive supervision and electronic monitoring programs include both probationers and parolees (table 6.9).

## Wyoming

"Other" race includes 27 Hispanic parolees of unknown race (table 6.7).

The State reported having an electronic monitoring program, but is unable to provide the number of parolees in the program on December 31, 1995 (table 6.9).
