I don't like receiving \*any\* SPAM, and I especially dislike pornographic SPAM, but it is my understanding that some IP's tell their clients to have emails sent from certain other IP's with word SPAM in the subject in order to \*bypass\* their SPAM filters.

It seems that some filters refuse not only certain subject words, but even email from other IP's that run open relays (like mine - Comcast!). If the word SPAM is in the subject line, it will actually bypass the SPAM filter and be allowed through.
