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FCC ISSUES UPDATED CONSUMER ADVISORY ON FCC DO-NOT-CALL RULES

Because of the series of judicial and legislative actions occurring since the National Do-Not-Call Registry went into effect on October 1, 2003, the Consumer & Governmental Affairs Bureau of the Federal Communications Commission today issued an update of the consumer advisory originally issued on September 30, 2003.

The advisory, entitled "Do-Not-Call Rules – What Consumers Can Do," outlines specific steps consumers can take if they have put their names on the National Do-Not-Call Registry and are called by telemarketers on or after October 1, 2003. It provides information about when there is a violation of the FCC do-not-call rules, and specifics about how to file a complaint.
