

Extended Index of Additional Readings Related to Recreation Fees and the USDA-Forest Service's Recreational Fee Demonstration Program

Summary

This document is a supplement intended for use with <u>Issues and Concerns Related to the USDA Forest Service's Recreational Fee Demonstration Program</u>. It allows those who seek additional information about the USDA-Forest Service's Recreation Fee Demonstration program and fees in general to find relevant sources of information quickly and easily. This index has two primary sections. The first contains parenthetical references presented by subject for ease of reference and the second contains all cited sources arranged alphabetically. The subjects parallel those found in the Issues and Concerns document. A specific index of the most relevant sources appears in the related document entitled <u>Supplement 1: Short Index of Readings Related to Recreation Fees and the Recreational Fee Demonstration Program</u>.

A primary source for this project has been an annotated bibliography completed in 1999 by staff of the USDA Forest Service's Rocky Mountain Research Station. It contains descriptions of 294 research publications related to recreation fees or the Recreational Fee Demonstration program and published between 1963 and 1999. That document is currently an unpublished reference resource available electronically and publicly on the Internet at Recreation Fee Bibliography - Wildland Resource Valuation or through the following direct address: (http://www.fs.fed.us/rm/value/research-recfee_bibliog.html).

Other significant sources include Congressional Hearing testimony, annual agency reports submitted to Congress, reports related to Individual Recreation Fee Demonstration program pilot projects, and reports compiled by the General Accounting Office and Congressional Research Service. The Forest Service distributes electronic copies of annual agency reports and other materials related to the program through the Recreation Fees on National Forests website. 
