SUMMARY OF CHANGES:** Section 940 of the Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement, and Modernization Act of 2003 requires the Secretary to annually adjust the amount in controversy thresholds for the administrative law judge and judicial review levels by a dollar amount equal to the percentage increase in the medical care component of the consumer price index, rounded to the nearest multiple of \$10.

## **Attachment - One-Time Notification**

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**SUBJECT:** Annual Changes to the Amount in Controversy (AIC) Thresholds for the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) and Judicial Review Levels of the Claim Appeals Process as Required by Section 940 of the Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement, and Modernization Act (MMA) of 2003

#### I. GENERAL INFORMATION

- **A. Background:** In the Medicare fee-for-service claim appeals process, the minimum amount in controversy (AIC) thresholds required to request an ALJ hearing or judicial review are \$100 and \$1000 respectively. Section 940 of the MMA now requires the Secretary to make annual adjustments to these thresholds. This one-time notification explains how the new AIC threshold affects contractors' decision letters.
- **B.** Policy: Section 940 of the MMA requires CMS to annually adjust the amount in controversy thresholds for the ALJ and judicial review levels by a dollar amount equal to the percentage <u>increase</u> in the medical care component of the consumer price index for July 2003 to the July preceding the year involved. If the adjusted amount is not a multiple of \$10, CMS must round the amount to the nearest multiple of \$10. Each year CMS will publish a notice in the Federal Register to announce the adjusted amount if there is a change. The adjusted amount will become the new AIC threshold for all <u>requests</u> for ALJ hearings or judicial reviews made in the calendar year following its publication in the Federal Register.

The new AIC threshold must be identified in hearing officer hearing and Part A redetermination decisions issued on or after January 1, 2005. For hearing officer hearing and Part A redetermination decisions issued November 3 through December 31, contractors must notify the parties to an appeal of the AIC threshold required for an ALJ hearing on or before December 31, as well as the AIC threshold required beginning January 1.
