Re: Email Authentication

In considering various means of authentication, please ensure that any proposed standard is open to all to implement and/or distribute without fee or individual (license) registration.

The recent proposals (and allegedly patented technology) Microsoft pitched to the Madrid working group represent the efforts of a convicted monopoly attempting to hijack major additional market sectors.

If the Madrid group had selected the Microsoft technology, with the proposed license, Microsoft would have been given a BIG lever to block alternative email software developers from pursuing any 'open source' marketing strategy. This would be the direct result of the requirement that the software provider is responsible for ensuring that all distributed copies are 'properly registered' with Microsoft. The trap is that the software cannot be freely re-distributable, if the original vendor is responsible for making sure that all re-distributed copies have been properly registered. While not an unfair burden on commercial software, this would give Microsoft a means on locking non-commercial developers out of the email server market.

Please keep the Internet based on free and open standards.
