# Common State EOP Functions

# Federal Emergency Support Functions

#### Communications

★ Describes the primary and backup communications systems and procedures the organizations will use during response and recovery operations.

### Warning

★ Describes the warning systems and responsibilities and procedures for using these systems.

## **Emergency Public Information**

★ Describes policies, roles, responsibilities, and procedures for increasing public awareness of the hazards and the need for individual and family preparedness. Provides a means for informing populations at risk about the danger and explaining the appropriate protective steps they should take before, during, and after an emergency.

#### **Evacuation**

- ★ Describes policies, roles, responsibilities, and procedures for evacuating people and critical supplies from a risk area when emergency conditions make such actions necessary.
- ★ Describes areas likely to be evacuated, determines destinations, travel routes, methods of travel, and the approach for controlling the flow of evacuees.

#### **Mass Care**

Describes the policies, roles, responsibilities, and procedures for:

- Providing shelter to protect people from the effects of the disaster.
- ★ Providing housing, food, clothing, first aid, and other essentials to the people that have been displaced from their homes by the disaster.

#### **ESF-2 Communications**

Upon request provides:

- ★ Telecommunications support to State response elements
- ★ Communications support to assist in dissemination of warning to the public.

The Public Information Annex to the FRP indicates that Federal representatives in the Joint Information Center (JIC) will coordinate with the State before releasing information to the public. Under ESF-6, the American Red Cross provides a Disaster Welfare Information service.

# **ESF-1 Transportation**

★ Provides transportation support to move evacuees upon request.

#### **ESF-6 Mass Care**

★ Provides tents, other temporary shelters, food and feeding units, first aid services, and disaster welfare information to help displaced family members upon request.

### **ESF-11 Food**

★ Coordinates with State officials to determines the food needs of the population in the disaster area.
