The intent of this mandate is to retard the growth of scrap tires in the United States, and the resulting environmental problems these tires cause, until a long-term solution for proper disposal can be obtained. All government agencies are required to purchase a retread tire in lieu of a new tire unless there is a valid justification for the purchase of a new tire. All new and retread tires in this schedule have undergone extensive qualified products list (QPL) testing to assure the utmost level of safety and quality of the tires furnished to government users. This testing exceeds Department of Transportation (DOT) requirements for both new and retread tires to be made in the United States.




