The Public Health Training Network (PHTN) is an internationally recognized resource for high quality public health training and continuing education that addresses:

- core competencies

National in scope, the PHTN is a network of partners who contribute the HUMAN, FINANCIAL, and TECHNICAL resources necessary to train public health practitioners.

It is centrally led and staffed by the Division of Professional Development and Evaluation, Public Health Practice Program Office at Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Since 1993, PHTN together with public health partners, has designed a technology based learning system and operational strategy that has:

- Led the development of a national distance learning infrastructure
- Trained and coordinated the work of Distance Learning Coordinators in each state
- Advocated for the establishment and utilization of distance learning standards

The system PHTN has developed includes resources and expertise for assessing needs, developing distance learning programs, marketing, delivering training, supporting learners, recognizing success and evaluating results.
