This letter responds to AOL Time Warner Inc.'s Motions for Approval of Non-Affiliated ISP and Alternative Cable Broadband ISP Service Agreement in connection with four ISPs: New York Connect.Net, Ltd., (2) Internet Junction Corp., (3) Internet US.
