Mission

Promote cost effective Department of Energy (DOE) mission accomplishment by providing corporate policy and guidance to meet current and future environmental compliance requirements, developing guidance for Departmental environmental stewardship responsibilities and setting goals to minimize the environmental impacts of DOE operations.

Functions

- 1. Serves as the central Departmental coordinating point for advocating DOE's position on environmental requirements and regulations proposed by other federal agencies (e.g., the Environmental Protection Agency).
- 2. Provides technical support to the Department's program offices and field elements in understanding and implementing environmental requirements.
- 3. Provides corporate leadership in promoting environmental protection through interaction with internal and external entities, advocating the Departmental position on emerging environmental requirements affecting DOE operations and issuance of guidance on Departmental compliance with newly promulgated requirements.
- 4. Promotes the implementation of environmental management systems throughout the Department to ensure that consideration of the environmental impacts of DOE operations are integrated into DOE's integrated Safety Management Systems.
- 5. Maintains effective liaison with other DOE and Environment, Safety and Health (EH) offices.
- 6. Assures that the Office implements an integrated approach to customer and stakeholder needs.
- 7. Participates in support of the Office of Planning and Management in the Strategic Planning and Program Planning Processes. Ensures that work plans conform to priorities resulting from these processes.

Develops policy and guidance to advocate and assist Departmental elements in implementing environmental management systems approaches into environmental programs and the integration of environmental management with integrated safety management. Develops policy and guidance to assist Departmental elements in the implementation of effective institutional controls. Provides a focal point for cross-cutting environmental performance information. OFFICE OF POLLUTION PREVENTION AND RESOURCE CONSERVATION POLICY AND GUIDANCE

Mission

Promote cost effective Department of Energy (DOE) accomplishment by minimizing the environmental impacts of DOE operations.

Functions

- Assesses and develops strategies, policies and guidance for meeting DOE goals for pollution prevention, waste minimization and the acquisition of environmentally preferable products. Prepares externally required corporate reports documenting the Department's progress in these areas.
- 2. Develops internal Departmental policies and guidance for Departmental compliance with applicable Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act, Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act, Pollution Prevention Act, and Toxic Substances Control Act issues and requirements.
- 3. Acts as the coordinator and advocate for the Department with other Federal agencies, such as the Environmental Protection Agency and the Department of the Interior, or Department of Energy policy positions and concerns in those agencies' rulemaking efforts in order to assure the Department's position is reflected in the formulation of other agencies' regulations that may affect DOE facilities, operations and activities.
- 4. Provides corporate support to program and field elements in the interpretation and implementation of statutory and emerging regulatory environmental requirements relative to hazardous waste management, toxic chemical inventory reporting, natural resource trusteeship, and hazardous substance release response.
- 5. Formulates procedural methodologies for streamlining/accelerating waste management and environmental restoration efforts compliant with statutory and regulatory environmental requirements, and in cooperation with the Office of Environmental Management, provides multi-disciplinary teams of environmental specialists to support field elements in implementing streamlining methodologies.
- 6. Provides a Department-wide focal point for cross-cutting environmental compliance/performance information. Coordinates, validates, and distributes statutory, regulatory and executive order-mandated corporate environmental reports.
