## ON-LINE PHARMACEUTICAL SALES STATE REGULATORY CONCERNS

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- I. Existing Regulatory Structure in Maryland
  - A. Sales of prescription drugs must comply with State laws governing:
    - 1. Practice of Pharmacy, Md. Health Occ. Code Ann. § 12-101 et seq.
    - 2. Practice of Medicine, Md. Health Occ. Code Ann. § 14-301 et seq.
    - 3. Consumer Protection, Md Com. Law Code Ann §13-301 et seq.
  - B. Maryland Uniform Electronic Transaction Act, Md. Com. Law Code Ann.
     21-101 et seq. (facilitates the use of internet in the provision of health care services).

## II. Competing Concerns

- A. Affordable Access
  - 1. State Attorneys General have formed Pharmaceutical Pricing Task Force (PPTF) to address the high cost of prescription drugs. Multi-disciplinary approach views prescription drug pricing issues from three perspectives: antitrust, healthcare/Medicaid fraud and consumer protection.
  - State legislative initiatives
     Hundreds of bills pending in state legislatures around the country attempting to address high cost of drugs.
  - 3. To what extent are internet sales less/more expensive
- B. Safety and Efficacy.
  - 1. How can the State ensure consumer welfare
