<i>Code:</i>	MARGIN
<i>Brief Definition:</i>	marginalized community members
<i>Full Definition:</i>	Community groups that are negatively perceived as socially and/or physically outside the larger community structure. In marginalized groups, boundaries are imposed by others to keep “unfavorable” groups from participating in or interacting with the mainstream community groups
<i>When to Use:</i>	Apply this code to all references to groups of individuals that the larger community has marginalized. These individuals or groups may be referred to as outcasts, extremists, radicals, or explicitly described as peripherals, strangers, outsiders, ostracized, bizarre, etc.
<i>When Not to Use:</i>	Do not use this code for reference to community groups institutionalized for health or criminal reasons (see INSTIT) or for groups that have voluntarily placed themselves on the outer boundaries of community life (see SELFMAR).
<i>Example:</i>	“Then you got the outcast blacks -- drug dealers, junkies, prostitutes.”
