Dear Dr. Juhl and Ms. Burkett:

The Office for Human Research Protections (OHRP) has reviewed your letters dated February 25 and 26, 2004 regarding allegations of noncompliance with Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) regulations for the protection of human research subjects (45 CFR Part 46) involving the above-referenced research.

OHRP has determined that the corrective actions summarized below appropriately address the issues raised:

It was alleged that the researchers failed to ensure adequate provisions to protect the privacy of subjects and to maintain the confidentiality of data, as required by HHS regulations at 45 CFR 46.111(a)(7).

Corrective Action: OHRP acknowledges Carnegie Mellon University's (CMU) and University of Pittsburgh's (U Pitt) statements that no further recruitment will be undertaken in Ms. Troxel's study until a revised recruitment process and letter have been approved by the CMU and U Pitt IRBs. Such a process will involve a letter directly from Dr. Clark introducing Ms. Troxel and the new study which will be on CMU letterhead, and only Dr. Clark will subsequently contact subjects to see if they are interested in participating in Ms. Troxel's study. Ms. Troxel and Dr. Matthews will not be provided with any information about subjects until subjects give Dr. Clark consent to share that information, or contact Ms. Troxel directly. In addition, the U Pitt and CMU IRBs are enhancing their training for IRB members and researchers on confidentiality issues to help prevent such an incident in the future.

As a result, there should be no need for further involvement of OHRP in this matter. Of course, OHRP must be notified should new information be identified which might alter this determination.

OHRP appreciates the continued commitment of your institutions to the protection of human research subjects. Please do not hesitate to contact me should you have any questions.
