Community Hurricane Preparedness, IS-324

FEMA offers an Independent Study training course in **Community Hurricane Preparedness** for Federal, state, and local emergency managers and others with responsibilities for or an interest in decision making for hurricane-prone areas. The course provides information about the following topics:

- How hurricanes form
- The hazards posed by hurricanes
- How the National Weather Service forecasts hurricane behavior
- The tools and guiding principles that can help emergency managers prepare their communities

The course is offered in two forms: on CD-ROM and on the World Wide Web. Because of limited quantities, the IS 324 CD-ROM is available only to members of the emergency management community and officials with decision making responsibility at the Federal, state, or local level who work with hurricane-prone areas in the following states and territories:
