SUBJECT: Change in Procedure for State Requests for Retrospective Medicare Claims

This Program Memorandum provides contractors with updated instructions regarding states' requests for retrospective Medicare claims. Over the past several months, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has reviewed the current procedure of Medicare contractors providing the states access to the Adjudicated Claims File (ACF).

Medicare contractors can no longer provide ad-hoc retrospective claims to their state trading partners because these requests require special software that is not part of the core business of the Medicare contractors, whose principal job is to adjudicate current Medicare claims. Therefore, as of May 31, 2002, Medicare contractors will no longer provide ad-hoc retrospective claims to states. Instead, states may access Medicare claims files for adjusted, denied, and paid claims for their dually eligible population directly from CMS on a one-time basis. Contractors will continue to provide "crossover" claims to the states according to the terms of your trading partner agreements for coordination of benefits purposes. A State Medicaid Directors letter effective May 31, 2002, has been issued to alert the states of this change.
