In Stoddard County, minor flooding was reported on Highway 25 at J Highway near Bloomfield. In Cape Girardeau County, minor flooding was reported on Highway 25 near Delta. Thunderstorms dumped from 3 to 6 inches of rain over the area. At the Cape Girardeau airport, an automated observing system measured 3.05 inches during the morning hours, including about 1.5 inches in an hour. Reports from co-operative observers included 5.0 inches in Advance and 4.0 inches in Jackson.
