The Ohio River remained above flood stage at Shawneetown from late November into early December. Minor flooding occurred, with some low-lying fields and flood plains underwater. The river crested several feet above flood stage on November 28 and fell slowly during early December.

Winter Weather/Mix

One to three inches of snow fell across parts of southern Illinois, from Mount Vernon east to the Wabash River. In White County, the city of Carmi reported the highest amount, which was 2.5 inches. Keensburg, in Wabash County, also reported 2.5 inches. Accumulations of one inch were reported as far south as West Frankfort (in Franklin County) and Shawneetown (in Gallatin County). Roads were snow-covered and slippery in some areas, with icy patches.

Winter Weather/Mix

Two to three inches of snow fell across southwest Indiana. In Gibson County, Princeton measured 3.5 inches. Three to 3.5 inches was reported at Evansville. A daily maximum snowfall record was set at Evansville. Numerous traffic accidents were reported in the Evansville area. A dozen accidents were reported on Interstate 164, especially on bridges and exit ramps. Three ramps were blocked.

Winter Weather/Mix

One to two inches of snow fell across northwest Kentucky. Accumulations of one inch were reported as far south as the Western Kentucky Parkway, including Greenville (in Muhlenberg County) and Dawson Springs (near the Caldwell/Hopkins County line). About 1.5 inches fell in the Owensboro area, and Sebree (in Webster County) measured 2 inches. Some accidents were reported in the Henderson area as roads became locally icy.
